



The Liberty Bell Wanderers
 Welcomes You to the
Valley Forge - Historic
 AVA Sanctioned Year Round Event



This AVA rated 2A 11/8km walk is mostly on blacktop multi-use trails in rolling countryside in the most historical part of the park. Passes most major memorials, log huts and Washington's HQs and the Valley Forge Visitor Center.

The starting point is Washington Memorial Chapel Cabin Shop. The Cabin Shop is run completely by volunteers. It offers sandwiches, home-made baked goods, beverages, and souvenirs. Restrooms are available across the driveway. Key is in the Cabin Shop inside the front door.

You are welcome to visit the Washington Memorial Chapel. It is open daily 10-5. In the lobby of the bell tower is the Justice Bell, a full-size replica of the Liberty Bell that was taken on a 5,000 mile tour of all 67 PA counties in 1915 for women's suffrage. There is no charge.

OSB or PSB Walk Registration (not both):

Please use either the Online Start Box (OSB) or Physical Start Box (PSB) to register and complete the event. Do NOT mix and match. For example, do not register using the OSB, then complete your event using the PSB (nor sign the PSB log sheet). The sponsoring club only receives credit for an OSB participation when an OSB registration has been completed online by entering your participation date, distances, and any special programs using the OSB.

OSB Walk Completion and Walk Credit:

When using OSB registration, upon physically completing the walk, please login to your Online Start Box account click on the "My Start Box" tab, then the "Finish Table" tab, then click on "Go to Finish Table" button for the event you have completed. Use the displayed entry form to submit the date and distance of your walk as well as select applicable AVA Special Programs to generate stamped "virtual" insert cards that you may choose to print out.

Starting Point Address:

Washington Memorial Chapel Cabin Shop
 2000 Valley Forge Park Rd
 King of Prussia PA 19406

 Free parking in Washington Memorial Chapel
 Parking lot

PSB Location:

The start box is located inside the Cabin Shop.
 You will need to ask the staff for the "Walk
 Box".

Driving Directions:

From the South: I-95 North to I-476 North to
 I-76 West. Continue to US 202 South (Exit
 328). Exit 422 West, stay in the right lane and
 exit to Route 23 West. Left on Route 23 then
 right to continue on Route 23, do not enter the
 Valley Forge Park, instead **follow Route 23 as
 it curves to the left to the Washington
 Memorial Chapel. Turn Right before the chapel
 into the parking lot. The Cabin Shop is located
 behind and downhill from Washington Memorial
 Chapel.

From Pa Turnpike: Exit at Valley Forge
 Interchange (Exit 326). After the toll booth,
 stay in the right lane take the next exit to N
 Gulph Rd then at the stoplight Right on Gulph
 Rd. Follow N Gulph Rd, going past the entrance
 to Valley Forge Park, joining Route 23. Follow
 directions (**) above.

Walking Instructions:

Map is included for both the 11km & 8km walks.

Abbreviations used:

ns - No Sign. There is no street sign.
 SP - Special Program

These walk directions and maps may only be used in
 conjunction with a signed American Volkssport Association
 athletic waiver. All other uses are prohibited.

1. Exit the Cabin Shop and walk to the front of
 the chapel.

The **Cabin Shop** is run completely by volunteers.
 It offers sandwiches, home-made baked goods,
 beverages, and souvenirs. **Restrooms** available
 across the driveway. Key is in the Cabin Shop
 inside the front door.

Washington Memorial Chapel was built as a
 monument to George Washington and is an active
 Episcopal parish in Valley Forge. In the chapel
 are beautiful stained-glass windows and
 sculptures. You are invited to visit. On display
 in the tower chamber is the Justice Bell a half-
 size replica of the Liberty Bell used in the
 Women's Suffrage movement.

2. **CROSS** Rte. 23 at the crosswalk and turn
LEFT on the paved trail - the **Joseph Plumb
 Martin Trail (JPM)** and continue to the
 Visitor Center.

The Joseph Plumb Martin Trail was named for a
 young private from Connecticut who enlisted in
 Washington's Continental Army at age 16 and
 served for the duration of the war. At age 70
 he wrote a book detailing all he observed during
 the war including his time in Valley Forge. It
 remains in publication to this day under the title
 "Private Yankee Doodle"

3. **CROSS** County Line Rd. and continue uphill.
4. Turn **RIGHT** at the sign for Visitor Center &
 Main Parking Lot.
5. **CROSS** the entrance road and pass in front
 of the newly renovated Visitor Center.

Restrooms are available in the VC.

6. Continue **RIGHT** past the VC. Follow the
 sidewalk to a crosswalk and turn **LEFT** on the
 paved path and go up a slight hill.
7. Just before the stop sign, turn **RIGHT** and
 return to the **JPM Trail**. Follow the trail to
 the **National Memorial Arch**.
8. Bear **LEFT** at the stop sign. Straight ahead
 is the **National Memorial Arch**. Walk
 through the arch. **4K**

The National Memorial Arch was dedicated in 1917 to commemorate the suffering and sacrifices of the men and officers during the encampment.

9. Follow the path straight to the parking lot. Cross the road at the stop sign, then walk across the grass to the **JPM Trail**. Continue to the **LEFT** on the trail.

You will pass two columns on the left commemorating officers from Pennsylvania - Generals John Armstrong and Peter Muhlenberg.

Restrooms located in the parking lot for Wayne's Woods.

10. Just before reaching a solar panel, turn **RIGHT** on the asphalt trail (do not continue straight as the trail goes into the woods). You will also see a sign indicating **JPM Trail**. After a short distance on this trail, turn **RIGHT** on the gravel trail. This trail or road is known as the **Baptist Trace** and goes through Artillery Park. **Alternate:** You may follow the **JPM Trail** when the **Historic Trace** is muddy or slippery.

11. At the end of the Baptist Trace, turn **RIGHT** on the **JPM Trail**. Cross Gulph Rd. and continue to the von Steuben statue. **7K**

General von Steuben of Prussia was Washington's drillmaster. He taught the soldiers how to use the bayonet, and most importantly, how to re-form lines quickly during battle.

If walking the 8K, turn **RIGHT** at the kiosk for Varnum's Quarters. Follow the trail until you reach the crosswalk in front of the chapel. Off to the right is a 50' obelisk which marks the only identified grave in the park. **CROSS** Rte. 23 at the crosswalk and return to the Start Point.

12. At the kiosk for Varnum's Quarters, turn **LEFT**, go across the parking lot, through the stop sign, and cross Rte. 23

13. Turn **LEFT** on the **JPM Trail**.

14. Turn **RIGHT** on **River Rd.** just beyond the sign for Washington's Headquarters. Follow the road to the sidewalk on the right. Continue on the sidewalk to the first building on the right where **Restrooms and Water** are available. Take the ramp in front of the restroom building as it goes downhill towards the train station.

If open, you are welcome to visit the museum inside the restored train station. Washington's Headquarters is the stone building closest to the train station which the public is also invited to tour. If open, there is a tour guide inside to answer any questions. There is no charge to visit either of these sites.

15. Just before the train station, turn **LEFT** on the narrow-paved path leading to the huts on the left. Continue on this path past the statue of Washington to **Potts Barn** (the white building).

16. At **Potts Barn**, follow the trail as it turns left. After approx. 25 yds., turn **LEFT** again to return to the **JPM Trail**. Continue on the trail as it goes up the hill. **9K**

17. Cross **River Rd.** Retrace your steps back to the crosswalk at Rte. 23

18. **CROSS** at the crosswalk and turn **LEFT**. Follow the trail as it goes past **Varnum's Quarters**.

Off to the right as you approach the crosswalk is a 50' obelisk which marks the only identified grave in the park.

19. **CROSS** Rte. 23 at the crosswalk and return to the Start Point.
