Nicknamed the "Southern Part of Heaven", Chapel Hill was named after the New Hope Chapel that stood upon a hill at the crossing of two main roads (where The Carolina Inn currently stands). The history of the Town is inextricably linked to the University. The Town was, in fact, created to serve the University.

When the UNC Board of Trustees chose the area around New Hope Chapel as the site for the first state university in 1793, they also named a committee to lay out a town adjacent to the site.

Town lots were auctioned in 1793 when work began on the first University building, although it was 1795 before any residents occupied permanent homes.

One of the "Public Ivies", UNC-Chapel Hill is a public research institution known for its acclaimed academic programs and lively sports fans. The university offers 74 bachelor's degrees—notably in political science, biology and psychology—through the College of Arts & Sciences and 13 professional schools.

There are numerous restaurants in the area for an after-walk meal.

Driving Directions to the Start Point - Wallace Parking Deck, 142 E Rosemary St, Chapel Hill, NC

From the East on I-40: take exit 273A / NC-54 West towards Chapel Hill. Merge onto NC-54 (becomes Raleigh Rd). In ~4 miles turn RIGHT on Country Club Rd. In .4 miles, turn RIGHT on Raleigh St. Cross Franklin (name changes to Hillsborough) and turn LEFT at next signal, E Rosemary St. Parking garage will be on the left in ~.3 miles.

From the West on I-40: Take exit 266 / NC-86 towards Chapel Hill. Turn RIGHT on NC-86 South / Martin Luther King Jr Blvd. In ~4 miles turn LEFT on E Rosemary St. The parking garage will be ahead on the right.

From both directions: Enter the garage on the East end of the building and park anywhere within it.

BE SURE TO PAY BEFORE LEAVING FOR YOUR WALK. See step #1 below for instructions.

Note: There are numerous parking garages and on-street parking spaces in the area. Feel free to use any of them but check the hours and prices. There is very little free parking in downtown Chapel Hill. If you use parking other than the Wallace garage, start your walk at 157 Franklin St.

1. Walk to the back (long) wall of the garage towards the stairs in the middle of the building. You need to be on level 4 for the payment kiosk. PAY FOR PARKING at kiosk, or by using the phone app "Park Mobile." Once you've paid, go up the stairs to exit garage. *Note: once you've exited, restrooms are available on the rear of the parking garage towards the end you drove in at.*
2. Veer RIGHT and head ACROSS alley to the Amber Alley walkway next to a tall glass elevator.
3. Go DOWN the stairs and walk entire length of walkway. Go UP the steps to exit walkway and turn LEFT. You are on Franklin St at address numbers 157 & 159.
4. At the 3rd signal, turn LEFT at Hillsborough (Raleigh St on right).
5. In one block go STRAIGHT at signal/Rosemary St. In one more block, turn RIGHT using crosswalk by fire hydrant, North St.
6. At stop sign, turn RIGHT on Boundary, walking on the right side of road.
7. At signal, CROSS Franklin and then turn LEFT to cross Boundary. Turn RIGHT to continue on Boundary for several blocks; road will curve to the right.
8. Boundary ends at multi-road intersection. Turn HARD-LEFT up slight hill (no sign- Country Club Rd). **POI #1**
9. At signal, turn LEFT on Gimghoul Rd.
10. Gimghoul ends at a 'Y'; continue STRAIGHT ahead on dirt/gravel road into wooded area. **POI #2**
11. When the roadway splits, stay to the LEFT. In a short distance look on the left for steps and a sign for "Lover's Loop" (sign is sometimes knocked over). You have two options:
 - a) **For an extra 1K**, turn LEFT and go down steps.
 - b) Trail curves right and is marked by wooden 4x4's.
 - c) About 150'-200' after stone chair, turn RIGHT up the stairs.
 - d) At a wooden bench, trail veers LEFT downhill and then back up. Trail meanders up and down for a while.

- e) After a long downhill section, the trail makes a HARD-LEFT turn. DO NOT take the trail downhill. Veer RIGHT uphill on the narrower path instead. Watch carefully for the trail at this point; you will be heading uphill towards the “castle”.
- f) At sign for Lover’s Loop trail, head RIGHT uphill. Trail is narrower and rocky.
- g) You will come to a semi-circular stone seating area. Continue PAST this to connect with the main dirt/gravel road.
- h) Turn LEFT on road passing in front of the castle. Continue with step 12.

To continue on main trail without the extra 1K: continue on dirt road as it curves to the right and goes past Gimghoul Castle. Continue with step #12.

- 12. Veer LEFT to rejoin the main dirt road.
- 13. When you reach the paved road, immediately turn RIGHT on road (no sign-Glandon Dr).
- 14. Veer RIGHT and then LEFT to stay on this road. Road will meander through a residential and wooded area.
- 15. At stop sign, turn RIGHT heading towards stoplight.
- 16. At signal, go STRAIGHT ahead, crossing Country Club Dr. Cemetery will be on your left, theater on right.
- 17. At third entrance to cemetery, turn LEFT. **POI #3**
- 18. Almost immediately, look for the headstone for William F Strowd on the right. Go past this and a large tree and then turn RIGHT on a barely visible path. Head STRAIGHT towards the wrought iron fence.
- 19. Turn LEFT passing between a 2nd, more ornate wrought iron fence and a rock wall.
- 20. Just past the rock wall on the left, at an orange water spigot, turn RIGHT on a brick-edged trail.
- 21. Turn LEFT on the asphalt trail and EXIT the cemetery.
- 22. Turn RIGHT on this street (South St); Carmichael Arena will be on the left.
- 23. At the signal (corner of Raleigh and South Streets), turn LEFT to cross South St.

- 24. Turn RIGHT and then immediately LEFT to head down brick walkway (Koman Way). Fetzer Hall will be on the right.
- 25. Continue PAST the circular planter and head UP a series of steps. The stadium will be ahead in the distance.
- 26. Trail emerges at Stadium Dr. Carefully CROSS the road to continue STRAIGHT ahead on brick path towards stadium (path may be hidden by parked cars).
- 27. You will come to Gate 1; veer to the LEFT keeping stadium on your right. Stay STRAIGHT on this path walking through a plaza; Chase Hall on left, Rams Head Rec center on right.
- 28. After the plaza, veer RIGHT to stay on the path, eventually crossing a bridge.
- 29. Immediately after the bridge, turn LEFT, walking along the edge of a wooded area. A multi-story red brick building will be on your right. Eventually you’ll pass between the Student Academics Services North and South buildings. Head towards the signal.
- 30. Use crosswalk on the right to cross Manning Dr. and continue STRAIGHT ahead, downhill on Skipper Bowles Dr. Continue past William Blythe Dr, parking lots and sign for Kenan-Flagler Business School.
- 31. Road curves left. Head towards the 3rd building (beige), using the diagonal path to the Carolina Basketball Museum. **POI #4**
- 32. When diagonal path ends, turn HARD-RIGHT to walk in front of the black-glass building (natatorium) and then the Dean Smith Center (basketball arena). **POI #5**
- 33. At the far end of Dean Smith, turn RIGHT to take stairs back down to road. Turn LEFT and head back uphill to Manning Dr.
- 34. At signal, turn LEFT on Manning.
- 35. At signal, turn RIGHT on Paul Hardin Dr.
- 36. Just past the tall, brick building, veer RIGHT into parking lot and immediately veer LEFT to take the brick walkway that heads into the woods.
- 37. Veer LEFT and LEFT again on the trail through the woods (sign for Kenan Stadium, gates 5-6).

38. Keep on the path that heads towards the stadium, and then is parallel to the stadium. **POI #6**
39. At gate 6 (on your right) go ACROSS roadway and veer RIGHT on brick sidewalk. Stay to the RIGHT to walk along a chain link fence, keeping the stadium on your right.
40. Go DOWN the steps and then veer LEFT to walk on wide brick walkway (parking garage on left, park on right).
41. Turn RIGHT at first walkway, heading down through park and towards the Ram statue.
42. Go to the LEFT of the Ram to head UP the road.
43. At stop sign, turn RIGHT, and immediately RIGHT again to enter the Bell Tower Plaza.
44. Walk around to the back of the tower, continuing on this path to exit the plaza at a crosswalk. Feel free to explore the tower up close, as long as you exit at the crosswalk.
45. CROSS road at the crosswalk and go STRAIGHT ahead on brick walkway (Wilson Library on left, House Library on right).
46. You will come to a quad (Polk Place Quad); continue STRAIGHT ahead on the right side; Bingham Hall will be on your right.
47. Before reaching the end of the quad, take any of the paths to head towards the center steps of the building with columns and the cupola, at the far end of the quad (South Building).
48. Go UP 1 set of steps and turn LEFT. Veer RIGHT through brick plaza between the South Building and Gerard Hall. Head towards the road.
49. Use the crosswalk to CROSS road (Cameron).
50. Go STRAIGHT ahead on brick walkway, keeping the yellow brick building on your left-Old West Bldg (*Special Program-Walking with the Wild Things: At the end of Old West, look at the building diagonally to your left. There are two gargoyles mounted on this building. These were originally mounted on the Westminster clock tower in London but were removed in 1933 because of deterioration. Katherine Pendleton Arrington, a patron of the arts in Chapel Hill, purchased them and gifted them to the university. Wander over for a closer look.*)
51. At the end of the Old West building, turn LEFT and then RIGHT at the trash cans/lamppost to the diagonal path that crosses the quad.
52. Once you've reached the other side of the quad, turn RIGHT to the Morehead Building.
53. Turn LEFT at the base of the steps and then RIGHT and walk along the front of the Morehead Planetarium. **POI #7** Restrooms available inside.
54. At end of Planetarium, turn RIGHT and follow path through the stone pillars to enter the Coker Arboretum on the gravel path. **POI #8**
55. CROSS a small wooden bridge and stay on this main path-do not make any turns.
56. You'll come to an entrance gate-DO NOT go through it. Turn RIGHT on the brick sidewalk staying inside the arboretum.
57. In fairly-quick succession, turn LEFT at each of the next 3 intersections you come to.
58. Go through the gate and turn RIGHT on the dirt path.
59. Follow the path to its end, go UP the steps and continue STRAIGHT ahead on brick sidewalk along the road (Cameron Ave); Davie Hall will be on your right).
60. Stay on this road for some distance, passing the Old Well. **POI #9**
61. Turn RIGHT at the first signal, S. Columbia. In the 2nd block you will pass UNC's Kenan Music Building and the Ackland Art Museum (*Special Program-Step to the Beat*).
62. CROSS and turn RIGHT on Franklin St. returning to the walkway, just past Ya-Ya teas at 157 E Franklin.
63. Turn LEFT to go through this passageway, Amber Alley, to return to the parking garage.

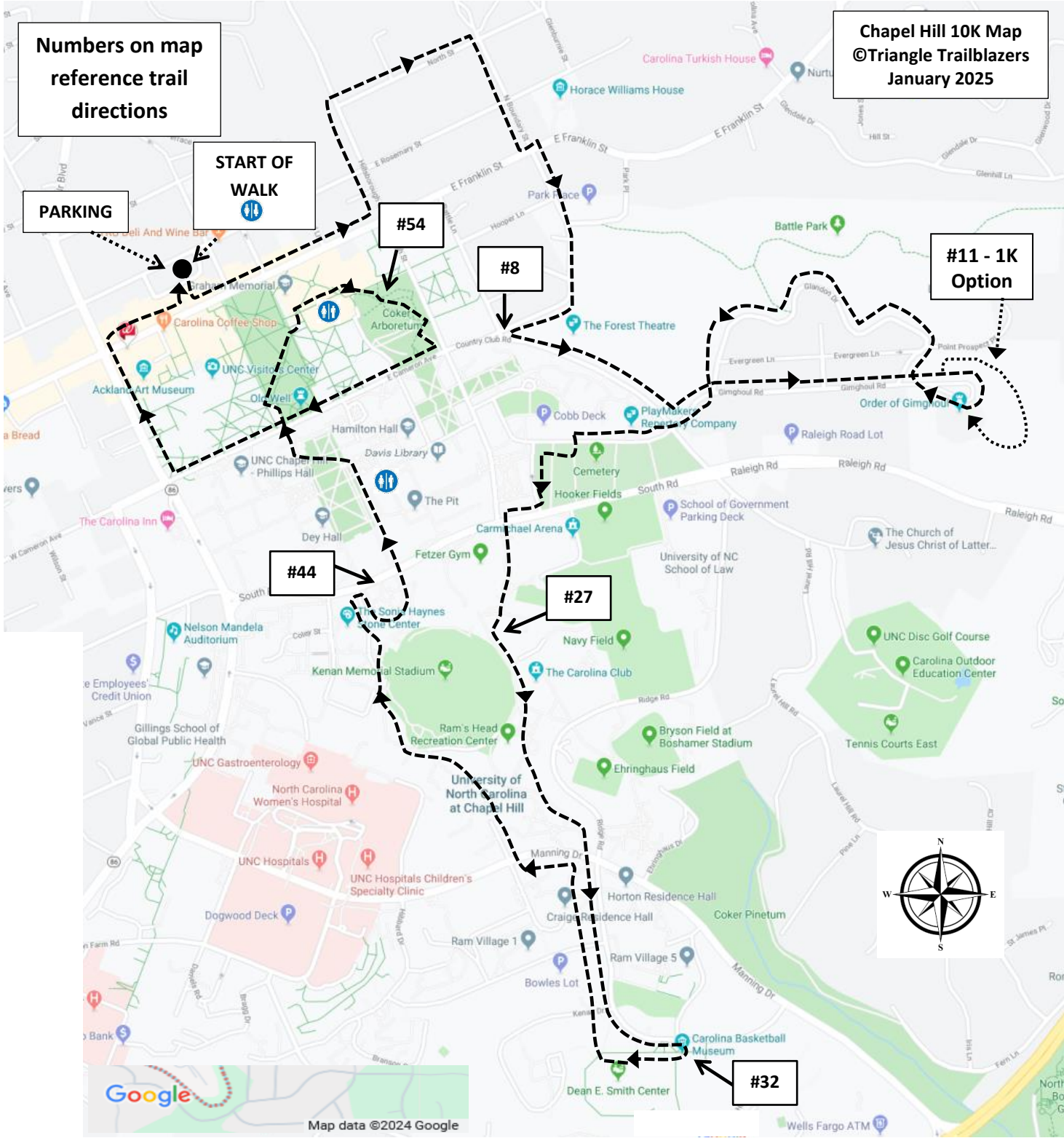

POI #1 Forest Theatre - Drama was first performed here in 1916 to celebrate the tercentenary of William Shakespeare's death. A few years later the location was better developed to allow the theatre to become a permanent fixture. The stone stage backdrop and seating area were built with WPA Funds in 1940.

POI #2 Gimghoul Castle – The Order of Gimghoul is a collegiate secret society headquartered at Gimghoul Castle (formerly known as Hippol Castle). The order was founded in 1889 and was formed around the legend and ideals of Arthurian knighthood and chivalry. The order seems to be social by nature, but information about it is strictly confidential. Membership is by invitation only, and includes “notable” male students, alumni and faculty. The castle took 6 years to build starting in 1920.

POI #3 The Old Chapel Hill Cemetery – Originally called the College Graveyard, the cemetery was used for internment of university students who died during their time at UNC. The first recorded burial is that of student George Clark, who died on Sept 26, 1798. However, most burials are from the 19th century. A 5-year project has recently been completed to locate the unmarked gravesites of African Americans who were buried in the 1800's in a separate section of the cemetery. 475 unmarked graves have been found using ground-penetrating radar.

POI #4 The Carolina Basketball Museum – chronicles the history of UNC Basketball and includes nearly 500 artifacts, along with hundreds of photographs and videos of various players, coaches, championships, and historic moments. The museum is the first university basketball-only museum in the country. Free admission.

POI #5 The Dean Smith Center – also known as the Dean Dome, is used primarily as the home for the UNC-Chapel Hill Tar Heel's Men's Basketball team. Fundraising to build the center began in 1980, and construction was completed in 1986. The opening game was on January 18, 1986, against the Duke Blue Devils.

The Tar Heels have played 33 seasons in the arena, with over 400 victories and less than 100 losses.

POI #6 Kenan Memorial Stadium – is primarily used as the home field of the UNC Tar Heels football team. The stadium opened in 1927 and holds 50,500 spectators. William R Kenan Jr, an 1894 UNC graduate and grandson of one of the original UNC Trustees, donated a large gift to build the stadium and an adjoining field house. The largest crowd to watch a game at the stadium was a 62,000 standing-room-only crowd in 2013.

POI #7 Morehead Planetarium – opened in 1949 and is one of the oldest and largest planetariums in the United States. It was the first planetarium to be built in the

South, and the 6th in the United States. At that time, it was the most expensive building ever built in North Carolina. It has been used to train Gemini and Apollo astronauts in celestial navigation.

POI #8 Coker Arboretum – was developed as an “outdoor classroom” starting in 1903 by UNC's first Professor of Botany, William Chambers Coker.

POI #9 The Old Well – for many years, served as the sole water supply for the university. In 1897 the original well was replaced by the current structure; it is modeled after the Temple of Love in the Gardens of Versailles. It is the most enduring symbol of UNC.

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5K Walk – YR314



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3. Go DOWN the stairs and walk entire length of walkway. Go UP the steps to exit walkway and turn LEFT. You are on Franklin St at address numbers 157 & 159.
4. At the 3rd signal, Hillsborough/Raleigh, turn RIGHT to cross Franklin and then turn LEFT to cross Raleigh. Continue STRAIGHT on Franklin.
5. In one block, CROSS and turn RIGHT on Battle Ln.
6. In one block, at stop sign, turn LEFT on Hooper Ln.
7. When Hooper ends, go STRAIGHT to carefully CROSS road and turn RIGHT (Boundary). Continue for several blocks; road will curve to the right.
8. Boundary ends at a multi-road intersection. Turn LEFT and immediately turn RIGHT to CROSS road at brick crosswalk. Turn LEFT up hill (no sign-Country Club Rd, woods on left).
9. At 1st signal, Gimghoul, turn RIGHT. Cemetery on left, theatre on the right.
10. At third entrance to cemetery, turn LEFT to enter. **POI #1**
11. Almost immediately, look for the headstone for William F Strowd on the right. Go past this and a large tree and then turn RIGHT on a barely visible path. Head STRAIGHT towards the wrought iron fence.
12. Turn LEFT passing between a 2nd, more ornate, wrought iron fence and a rock wall.
13. Just past the rock wall on your left, at an orange water spigot, turn RIGHT on a brick-edged trail.
14. Turn LEFT on the asphalt trail and exit the cemetery.

15. Turn RIGHT on road (South St-no sign)
Carmichael Arena is on your left.
16. In one block, CROSS and turn RIGHT on Raleigh Rd.
17. At first signal, CROSS Cameron Ave/Country Club Rd and turn LEFT on the dirt path which borders the Coker Arboretum. **POI #2**
18. Just before the end of the path, turn RIGHT into dirt corner-don't go up steps.
19. Veer just slightly LEFT and then turn RIGHT on the dirt path into the Arboretum. Continue STRAIGHT on this path soon passing a very large Loblolly pine on your right.
20. CROSS a brick walkway and then turn LEFT on the first dirt path (the wider path).
21. Stay on this path, eventually crossing a small wooden bridge. Continue on the main path as it curves to the left.
22. Exit the arboretum and head STRAIGHT towards the corner of the 3-story red brick building. Turn LEFT to walk in front of Morehead Planetarium. Walk the length of the building. **POI #3** Restrooms inside.
23. Go past the end of the building heading straight ahead. At the "T", turn RIGHT on the diagonal path. Graham Memorial Hall will be on your right.
24. At first intersection (6-way), turn HARD LEFT and then turn LEFT again at next path. You will pass the Caldwell Obelisk on your right.
25. Continue on this path as it diagonally crosses the quad, to the corner of the 3-story yellow brick Old East Bldg.
26. Go STRAIGHT past the Old East Building, keeping it on your left.
27. Turn RIGHT at road. You will soon pass The Old Well on your right. **POI #4** (Special Program-Walking with the Wild Things-to see gargoyles, turn RIGHT in front of next yellow-brick building, Old West. At the end of Old West, look at the building diagonally to your left. There are two gargoyles mounted on this building, Person Hall. These were originally mounted on the Westminster clock tower in London but were removed in 1933 because of deterioration.

Katherine Pendleton Arrington, a patron of the arts in Chapel Hill, purchased them and gifted them to the university. Wander over for a closer look, and then retrace your steps back to Cameron Ave and cross at crosswalk. Go to step #28).

28. Just past the well, turn LEFT at the 1st crosswalk to cross Cameron.
29. After crossing, turn LEFT back along road passing the South Building.
30. Just past the South Bldg, CROSS the grey stone crosswalk and then turn RIGHT onto the red brick sidewalk.
31. Continue on this sidewalk, walking the length of the quad.
32. At the end of the quad, continue STRAIGHT ahead; the Wilson Library will be on the right. Sidewalk will emerge at South Rd.
33. CROSS South Rd and go STRAIGHT ahead into the Bell Tower Plaza. Circle the tower clockwise, exiting at the other entrance on South St.
34. Turn LEFT on South St.
35. At first signal, (no street sign) turn RIGHT to cross South St, and then turn LEFT to continue on South St.
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
