



BURNT BRIDGE BIKE CRUISE
26Km rated 1A, stamp Y0732



Start is at east end of Burnt Bridge Creek Trail at **9117 NE 19th Circle, Vancouver, WA.**

GPS Coords: 45.6359, -122.5802.

DRIVING DIRECTIONS: From I-205, take Exit #28, Mill Plain Blvd. Southbound, turn right on Mill Plain Blvd. Northbound, stay in the left lane of the exit, circle under Mill Plain, bear right & then turn right onto Mill Plain Blvd heading west. Continue about 1.3 miles to right on NE 97th Ave, left in .75 miles on NE 14th St which becomes NE Woodridge St, right onto NE 92nd Ave, then 1st left onto NE 19th Cir.

Free on street parking available along 19th Circle. Park across the street from the homes.

Restrooms: Shown on the map at Divine Rd and west end of trail.

BIKE COMPLETION AND CREDIT: Be sure to log back into the OSB system to finish/complete your online registration after doing the event. The OSB system does not deduct any event fee from a participant's Event Bank until they have submitted event completion info including the event was biked, the distance biked, and the selection of applicable special programs that person is participating in. (Nevertheless, a fee of \$2 for a downloaded PDF is deducted from the user's Event Bank when the PDF is downloaded. Later, any PDF fees are credited back to a user's Event Bank when he/she submits the event completion info as a paying for credit participant. Note, however, the \$2 coupon for the downloaded PDF will expire in 60 days.)

"Please use either the Online Start Box (OSB) or Physical Start Box (PSB) to register and complete the event. Do NOT mix and match, for example, by registering using the OSB then completing your event using the PSB nor signing the PSB log sheet. The sponsoring club only receives credit for an OSB participation when an OSB registration has been completed online by entering your participation date, distances, and any special programs using the OSB."

These biking directions and maps may only be used in conjunction with a signed American Volkssport Association athletic waiver. All other uses are prohibited. For emergencies contact 911. Bike event owner is Tom Baltes and he can be reached at 505-298-1256.



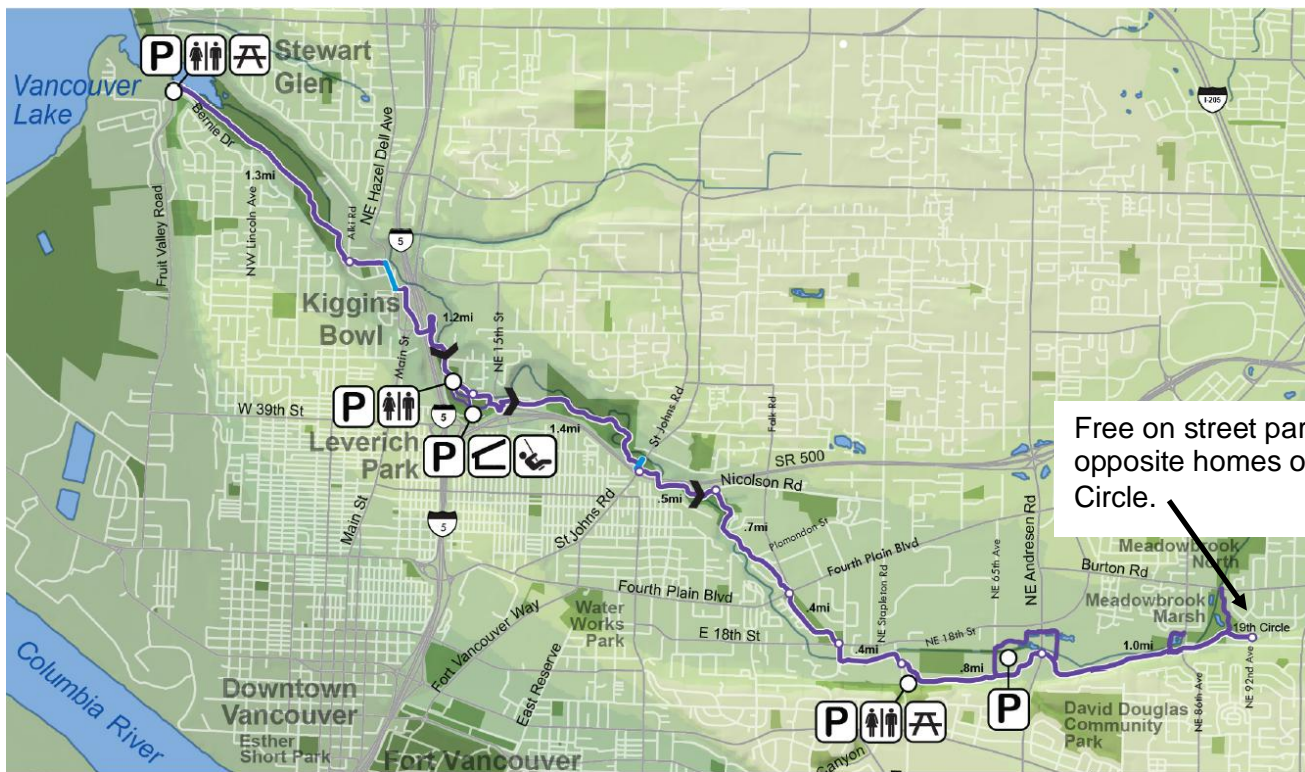
Burnt Bridge Bike Cruise

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Enter Burnt Bridge Creek Trail at the end of 19th Circle. The trail is 8 miles long (16 miles round trip) with distance markings painted periodically on the paved path. You will cross several busy streets, so exercise caution. As a multi-use trail you will share the space with walkers, bikers, skaters and pets on leash. Bathrooms are available at three locations along the route shown on this map. Turnaround at the trailhead at Fruit Valley Rd near Vancouver Lake and follow the trail back.

Stewart Glen

A green jewel in the heart of the city, Burnt Bridge Greenway begins at the northwest end of Stewart Glen, at the mouth of Burnt Bridge Creek at Fruit Valley and NW Bernie Drive. This shared-use, hard-surface trail offers excellent opportunities for walking, biking, jogging, commuting, and wildlife viewing. It meanders east along the creek through thick forests and grass bottomlands, and crosses over two bridges to end at Hazel Dell Avenue. On-street bike routes and sidewalks continue the route southeast to Kiggins Bowl, the Ellen Davis Trail, and Leverich Park. The eastern section, beginning at Devine Road allows walkers and bikers to travel almost eight miles from Stewart Glen in the west to 92nd Avenue in the east.

Leverich Park and Kiggins Bowl

Centrally located Leverich Park features open fields and patches of forest, easy walking trails, seasonal restrooms, a softball field, and quaint footbridges over Burnt Bridge Creek. The park also offers many picnic tables and a covered picnic area with 12 tables. The Burnt Bridge Creek Greenway trail starts just north, making Leverich Park's northern parking lot an excellent trailhead. Kiggins Bowl, on the west side of I-5, features a track and football field, an open sports area, and lovely tree-lined pathways.
