AVA Sanctioned Year Round Event



This AVA rated 2B 10km starts in Waikiki. Daylight hours. Walk along Diamond Head Road to the upscale Kahala District. Several lookout points along Diamond Head Road. During whale season (December to April), it is a great place to see humpback whales and watch the sunset. Special Program - Walking with America's Veterans (Operation Red Wings Medal of Honor Park - Formerly known as Ft. Ruger Park).

OSB or Remote Walk Registration (not both):

Please use either the Online Start Box (OSB) or Remote to register and complete the event. Do NOT mix and match. For example, do not register using the OSB, then request stamps from the POC. The sponsoring club only receives credit for an OSB participation when an OSB registration has been completed online by entering your participation date, distances, and any special programs using the OSB. See the my.ava.org event listing for information on remote registration.

OSB Walk Completion and Walk Credit:

When using OSB registration, upon physically completing the walk, please login to your Online Start Box account, click the "My Start Box" tab, then the "Finish Table" tab, then click the "Go to Finish Table" button for the event you have completed. Use the displayed entry form to submit the date and distance of your walk as well as select applicable AVA Special Programs to generate stamped "virtual" insert cards that you may choose to print out.

Restrooms:

There are restrooms at the start/finish of the walk in Kapiolani Beach Park. No restrooms along the route.

Starting Point Address:

Kaimana Beach Hotel Parking Lot
2863 Kalakaua Avenue
Honolulu, HI 96815

Driving Directions:

From Ala Moana - Take Ala Moana Blvd toward Waikiki. Turn right on Kalakaua Avenue. The start point is the parking lot of the Kaimana Beach Hotel parking lot. Limited free parking at the War Memorial Natatorium at 2815 Kalakaua Avenue (adjacent to Kaimana Beach Hotel). On street metered parking on Kalakaua Avenue.

Walk Directions:

These walk directions and maps may only be used in conjunction with a signed American Volkssport Association athletic waiver. All other uses are prohibited.

Kahala 10km

1. Exit hotel parking lot onto Kalakaua Avenue. Turn right on Kalakaua, left on Poni Moi Road, and right on Diamond Head Road.
2. Continue on Diamond Head Road, pass the Diamond Head Lighthouse and several scenic lookouts. The ocean will be on your right, Diamond Head Crater on your left. (Stop at the lookouts and enjoy the beautiful coastline. In December to

March, be on the lookout for humpback whales.

3. At Kaalawai Place, Diamond Head Road veers to the left. Continue straight on Kahala Avenue.
4. Turn left on Paikau Street, right on Kaimanahila Street, left on Hakaka Street, and right on Palekaua Street.
5. Turn right on Puu Panini Avenue, right on Kilauea Avenue, and right on Elepaio Street.
6. Turn right on Ahakea Street, right on Ahina Street, right on Aukai Street, and right on Kahala Avenue.
7. Continue on Kahala Avenue onto Diamond Head Road. The ocean will be on your left; Diamond Head Crater on your left.
8. At Beach Road, turn left and head down the paved walkway to the beach. Enjoy the view! After this short detour, return to Diamond Head Road.
9. After 3207 Diamond Head Road, turn left and walk toward the ocean (and right edge of Leahi Beach Park).
10. Take the cement walkway (the water will be below you on your left, homes will be on your right). At the end of the walkway, turn right, and exit Makalei Beach Park back onto Diamond Head Road.
11. Turn left on Diamond Head Road, left on Coconut Avenue, right at Kiele Street, and left Poni Moi Road.
12. Veer right to Kalakaua Avenue and stay on the left side, returning to the Kaimana Beach Hotel parking lot.
