Start Point: Silver Beach Club; 1025 S Atlantic Ave, Daytona Beach, FL 32118

Driving Directions: From I-95 Exit 261 (US Hwy 92/Intl Speedway), E on US 92/ISB to S Atlantic (US Hwy A1A) cross Intracoastal Waterway (approx 5 miles). Right to S Atlantic, approx 1.9 miles to The Silver Beach Club on the left. Ask desk clerk for box at the counter.

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1. This map and directions may only be used in conjunction with a signed American Volkssport Association athletic waiver. All other uses are prohibited.
2. Please use either the Online Start Box (OSB) or Physical Start Box (PSB) to register and complete the event. *Do NOT mix and match.* For example, if you register using the OSB, do not complete your event by using the PSB (nor sign the PSB log sheet). The sponsoring club only receives credit for an OSB participation when an OSB registration has been completed online by entering your participation date, distances, and any special programs using the OSB.
3. A fee of \$2 for a downloaded PDF is deducted from the user's Event Bank when the PDF is downloaded. Later, any PDF fees are credited back to a user's Event Bank when he/she submits the event completion info as a paying for credit participant. The \$2 coupon for the downloaded PDF will expire in 60 days.

After registering, **EXIT** the Silver Beach Club and walk to the corner of Atlantic Ave & Silver Beach Ave.

1. **CAREFULLY CROSS** Atlantic Ave and continue straight ahead on Silver Beach Ave to S. Peninsula Dr. *On the left at 406 Silver Beach Ave. is the Korean Baptist Church. This historic church is the first of its kind on the east coast of Florida.*
2. **CROSS** S. Peninsula and **CONTINUE** to the East end of the Tom Staed Veterans Memorial Bridge.
3. **TURN LEFT**, descend the ramp and walk under the bridge.
4. When on the North side of the bridge, **TURN RIGHT** and ascend the ramp, returning to street level.
5. **TURN LEFT** leaving the bridge, and walk to S. Peninsula Dr. *Look for LILIAN PLACE on the left. This beautiful old home, circa 1885, is on the National Register of Historic Places. Lilian Place is also the home where noted author Stephen Crane spent a short recovery period after his shipwreck off the coast of Daytona Beach in January 1897 and where he outlined his magnificent short story "THE OPEN BOAT".*

6. **TURN LEFT** onto S. Peninsula and continue for about a mile to Main St. Enjoy the beautiful riverfront homes along the way.
7. At Main St., **TURN RIGHT** and **CROSS** So. Peninsula. *ACROSS the street is the old Pinewood Cemetery. This served as a temporary burial ground for the body of Mr. Higgins, a shipmate of Stephen Crane on the ill-fated S.S. Commodore.*
8. **CONTINUE** to N. Wild Olive Ave, passing some notorious Bike Week landmarks such as Chopper World, Bank & Blues Club, and Dirty Harry's. At Humphreys, notice the mural on the buildings outside wall.
9. **TURN LEFT** at N. Wild Olive Ave, **CROSS** Main St., continue to Auditorium Blvd.
10. **TURN RIGHT** onto Auditorium Blvd. and walk past The Peabody Auditorium. *The present 2,500 seat auditorium was built in 1949 to replace the original Peabody, built in 1919. The money needed was donated by Simon Peabody, a wealthy lumberman and friend of Charles Burgoyne. The intent of the original theater was to augment the entertainment and activities at the Casino Burgoyne and supported by the Florida Forum and Assembly to bring artists and entertainers to Daytona Beach.*
11. **CONTINUE** on the sidewalk in front of the Daytona Beach Ocean (Convention) Center until the next traffic circle, then **BEAR LEFT** onto the sidewalk along the Ocean Center (OC).

12. At the end of the building **TURN LEFT** onto the OC driveway and walk to the center of the plaza. **TURN RIGHT** on the walkway towards the OC sign, (facing the Hilton across A1A – S. Atlantic Ave.) and walk to the sidewalk.

13. **TURN LEFT** on the sidewalk at S Atlantic Ave. and **CONTINUE** to Earl St. **CROSS** Earl and **CONTINUE** alongside the parking garage (on your left) until passing under the overhead walkway to the beach. Then look to your left for the colorful stairway leading to the enclosed crossover.

14. **CLIMB** the stairs, **TURN LEFT** at the top and **CROSSOVER** Atlantic Ave. *Just before reaching the stairwell at the east end of the crossover, you will note a directory of attractions in the Ocean Walk Shoppes. Slow the pace and explore the cafes and shoppes. (There are public restrooms located in several places in the complex.)* You need to eventually wind up on the ground level.

15. Once on the ground level. **EXIT** the Ocean Walk Shoppes to the **LEFT** and walk **ACROSS** the cement spectator pad in front of the Historic Bandshell, staying close to the stage. *Two American Presidents, William Clinton and George W. Bush, delivered historic speeches from this stage; at separate times, of course. Work began on the bandshell in 1936 under the WPA. The first concert was on July 4, 1937. In 1938, construction of the coquina structure was completed. Total cost of the Bandshell was \$268,000. It has a capacity of 4,500 in open-air seating.*

16. **EXIT** the Bandshell area through the archway nearest to the Bandshell stage and **TURN RIGHT** onto the Boardwalk. *This was the real name of this sidewalk when first constructed by the WPA in 1937. However, local usage has changed it over the years to "The Boardwalk" even though there were never any wooden boards used as part of the Boardwalk. Walk about 50 feet along the Boardwalk and on your right embedded in the coquina wall surrounding the Bandshell area is a bronze plaque commemorating an historic event. At this location on the beach, the Fleet of French Admiral Jean Ribault was wrecked during a storm.*

17. **CONTINUE** on the Boardwalk passing the Hotel, the Clock Tower and shops along the way to Main St.

18. Just **BEFORE** reaching Main St. overpass, **TURN LEFT** and walk down the steps to "THE WORLD'S MOST FAMOUS BEACH".

ALTERNATE ROUTE: If weather/tide conditions warrant or you do not wish to walk on the Beach, **INSTEAD** of Step 18, above, **TURN RIGHT** and walk 2 blocks to Atlantic Ave. **TURN LEFT** onto Atlantic Ave. **CONTINUE** at instruction #22.

19. **TURN RIGHT** on the Beach and walk **UNDER** the Main Street Pier. *The original Pier was built in 1912 by Charles Burgoyne as the Casino Burgoyne.*

20. **CONTINUE** for just over a mile on the beach until you come to the Silver Beach Ramp. Public Restrooms are located at the base of the ramp.

21. **TURN RIGHT** onto Silver Beach Ave. ramp and **EXIT** the beach.

22. **Return to the Start/Finish** The Silver Beach Club **on the corner** of Silver Beach Ave. and S. Atlantic Ave. Return to

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START/FINISH POINT: The Silver Beach Club, 1025 S. Atlantic Ave., Daytona Beach, FL 32118
Daytona Beach named for Mathias Day in 1876. (QUALIFIER: 'D' Walking the USA A-Z)

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After registering, **EXIT** the Silver Beach Club and walk to the corner of Atlantic Ave & Silver Beach Ave.

1. CAREFULLY CROSS Atlantic Ave and continue straight ahead on Silver Beach Ave to S. Peninsula Dr. *The Korean Baptist Church is at 406 Silver Beach Ave. This historic church is the first of its kind on the east coast of Florida.*

2. CAREFULLY CROSS S. Peninsula Dr. *Just BEFORE the bridge, look to your RIGHT to see LILIAN PLACE. This beautiful old home, circa 1885, has been listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Noted author Stephen Crane spent a short recovery period at Lilian Place after his shipwreck off the coast of Daytona Beach, January 1897 when he outlined his magnificent short story "THE OPEN BOAT".*

3. CROSS the Tom Staed Veterans Memorial Bridge *You will pass the Halifax Area Chamber of Commerce on your LEFT.*

4. Continue straight to the entrance of the Jackie Robinson Baseball Park .

This historic field is the site of Robinson's first appearance in a major league baseball game during Spring Training in 1946. Pause for a moment and admire the commemorative statue of Jackie and Friends.

5. Continue on Orange Avenue to just before Beach Street and the entrance to the Esplanade. *Across the street is the historic Daytona Beach Fire Station #1.*

6. TURN RIGHT into the Esplanade. Continue to ISB (International Speedway Blvd) *Across Beach Street note the Halifax Historical Museum (check their website for hours of operation), shops, restaurants, and antique stores along the way.*

7. CAREFULLY Cross ISB. Continue straight to the Veterans Memorial on your right.

8. Pass to the right of the memorial and take the bridge entering the Esplanade. *This is also a portion of the Sweetheart Trail that is part of the River to the Sea trail.*

9. TURN LEFT and continue walking behind the DSC's News-Journal building. **TURN RIGHT** and proceed on the Halifax River Overlook. *Note the bronze statue from local artist Paul Baliker.*

10. CONTINUE on the Esplanade past the News Journal building and Ranger station **TURN LEFT** and walk around the Mary McLeod Bethune bronze statue. *She was an educator, an organizer, and a political activist, and opened one of the first schools for African American girls.*

11. RESUME walking along the Esplanade taking the path to the **RIGHT** around the restrooms. On your right is Manatee Island.

OPTIONAL 1k: TURN RIGHT and walk around the perimeter of Manatee Island.

RESUME walking along the Esplanade to your right you will pass the Josie Rogers house. *She was an early female physician and the first female mayor of Daytona Beach.* Exiting the Esplanade **TURN RIGHT** and cross the Main Street bridge.

12. CONTINUE on Main Street **TURN RIGHT** at S. Halifax.

13. CAREFULLY Cross S. Halifax and **TURN LEFT** on ISB.

14. TURN LEFT on S. Peninsula, **TURN RIGHT** on 5th Avenue.

15. TURN RIGHT on S. Grandview.

17. At ISB, **TURN LEFT** and **CROSS** S. Grandview Ave. Continue to Atlantic Ave. (A1A) *At Atlantic Ave., look up to see the "World's Most Famous Beach" sign at the beach approach.*

18. TURN LEFT on Atlantic Ave. to Kemp St. *At 140 S. Atlantic Ave., you will pass the Streamline Hotel. This newly restored, storied art deco-style Hotel opened in 1941. It is the recognized birthplace of the National Association of Stock Car Auto Racing (NASCAR), due to a December 1947 meeting held in the rooftop hotel bar that formed the foundation for that organization that was made official in February 1948.*

19. TURN LEFT on Kemp St. to Coates St. **CROSS** and **TURN RIGHT** on Coates St. to Harvey Ave.

20. CROSS and **TURN LEFT** on Harvey Ave. to Grandview Ave. **CROSS** and **TURN RIGHT** on Grandview Ave. to Main St.

21. CROSS and **TURN LEFT** on Main St. to N. Wild Olive Ave. **CROSS** and **TURN RIGHT** on N. Wild Olive Ave. to Auditorium Blvd. *You will pass The Peabody Auditorium. The present 2,500 seat auditorium was constructed in 1949 to replace the original Peabody which was built in 1919 with funds donated by Simon Peabody, a wealthy lumberman who was a friend of Charles Burgoyne. The original theater was built to augment the entertainment and activities of the Casino Burgoyne and was encouraged by the Florida Forum and Assembly to bring artists and entertainers to Daytona Beach.*

22. CROSS and **TURN RIGHT** on Auditorium Blvd. to Atlantic Ave. *You are walking along the Ocean Center, Daytona's convention center.*

23. BEAR LEFT and walk through an area with frolicking dolphins leaping out of a cement ocean to the colorful stairway leading up to the enclosed crossover.

24. CLIMB the stairs, **TURN LEFT** at the top and **CROSSOVER** Atlantic Ave. *Just BEFORE reaching the stairwell at the east end of the crossover, you will note a directory of attractions in the Ocean Walk Shoppes. Now is the time to slow down the pace and explore the cafes and shoppes. (Public restrooms are in several places in the complex.) At the far East end, descend to the ground level.*

25. Once on the ground level, **EXIT** the Ocean Walk Shoppes to the **LEFT** and walk **ACROSS** the cement spectator pad in front of the Historic Bandshell, staying close to the stage. *Two American Presidents, William Clinton and George W. Bush, delivered historic speeches from this stage; at separate times, of course. Work started on the Bandshell in 1936 under the WPA. The first concert was on July 4, 1937. In 1938 construction of the coquina structure was completed. The total cost of the Bandshell was \$268,000. It has a capacity of 4,500 in open-air seating.*

26. EXIT the Bandshell area through the archway nearest to the Bandshell stage and **TURN RIGHT** onto the Broadwalk. *Broadwalk was the real name of this sidewalk when first constructed by the WPA in 1937. However, local usage has changed it over the years to "The Boardwalk" even though there were never any wooden boards used as part of the Broadwalk. Walk about 50 feet along the Broadwalk and on your RIGHT imbedded in the coquina wall surrounding the Bandshell area is a bronze plaque commemorating an historic event. At this location on the beach, the Fleet of French Admiral Jean Ribault was wrecked during a storm.*

27. CONTINUE on the Broadwalk passing the Hotel, the Clock Tower and several shops along the way to Main St.

28. Just **BEFORE** reaching Main St. overpass, **TURN LEFT** and walk down the steps to "THE WORLD'S MOST FAMOUS BEACH".

ALTERNATE ROUTE: If weather/tide conditions warrant or you do not wish to walk on the World's Most Famous Beach, at Main Street **TURN RIGHT**. Walk 2 blocks to Atlantic Ave. **TURN LEFT** onto Atlantic Ave., walk just over a mile to the Silver Beach Ave. Continue at instruction #32 below.

29. TURN RIGHT on the Beach, walk under the Main Street Pier. *Originally built by Charles Burgoyne as the Casino Burgoyne in 1912.*

30. CONTINUE for just over a mile on the beach until you come to the Silver Beach Ave. access ramp. At the base of the access ramp, there are Public Restrooms located in the building on the left.

31. TURN RIGHT onto this access ramp and **EXIT** the beach.

32. CONTINUE on the right side, to the corner of Silver Beach Ave. and S. Atlantic Ave. Continue to the Start/finish at The Silver Beach Club

UPDATED AUGUST 2018

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FOR 15KM AND 20 KM:

On 11K DIRECTIONS, AFTER #21,

- A. TURN LEFT** on Auditorium Blvd. to N. Hollywood Ave.
- B. TURN RIGHT** on N. Hollywood for 3 blocks until it ends at Butler Blvd.
- C. TURN LEFT** on Butler and then **TURN RIGHT** at N. Peninsula Dr. and continue 2 blocks, crossing Oakridge to Seabreeze Blvd.
- D. CROSS** Seabreeze using crosswalk and **TURN LEFT** 1 block to N Halifax Ave.
- E. TURN RIGHT** on N. Halifax. Continue **STRAIGHT** for 6 blocks until reaching Flagstone Dr.
- F. TURN RIGHT** on Flagstone and then **LEFT** on Grandview Ave. for 1 block to Belaire Dr.
- G. TURN RIGHT** at Belair for one block. **TURN RIGHT** on Waverly Dr. And follow this winding road 1 block to Driftwood Ave.
- H. TURN LEFT** on Driftwood one block to Bel Aire Dr. *The Daytona Bridge Club is on the corner.*
- I. TURN RIGHT** on Bel Aire, and walk past the bridge club and the Schnebly Recreation center, on your left. Go around the bend to N. Wild Olive Ave. on your left.
- J. TURN LEFT** on N. Wild Olive for 5 blocks, back to Seabreeze Blvd.
- K. TURN LEFT** on Seabreeze for 2 blocks to N. Atlantic Ave (Rte A1A).
- L. TURN RIGHT, CROSS** Seabreeze and walk 3 blocks to Ora St. with A1A to your left. In front of you there is a pedestrian bridge over the road.

M. Look for the stairs up to the bridge. At this point. You will re-join the 11km route at **#24**

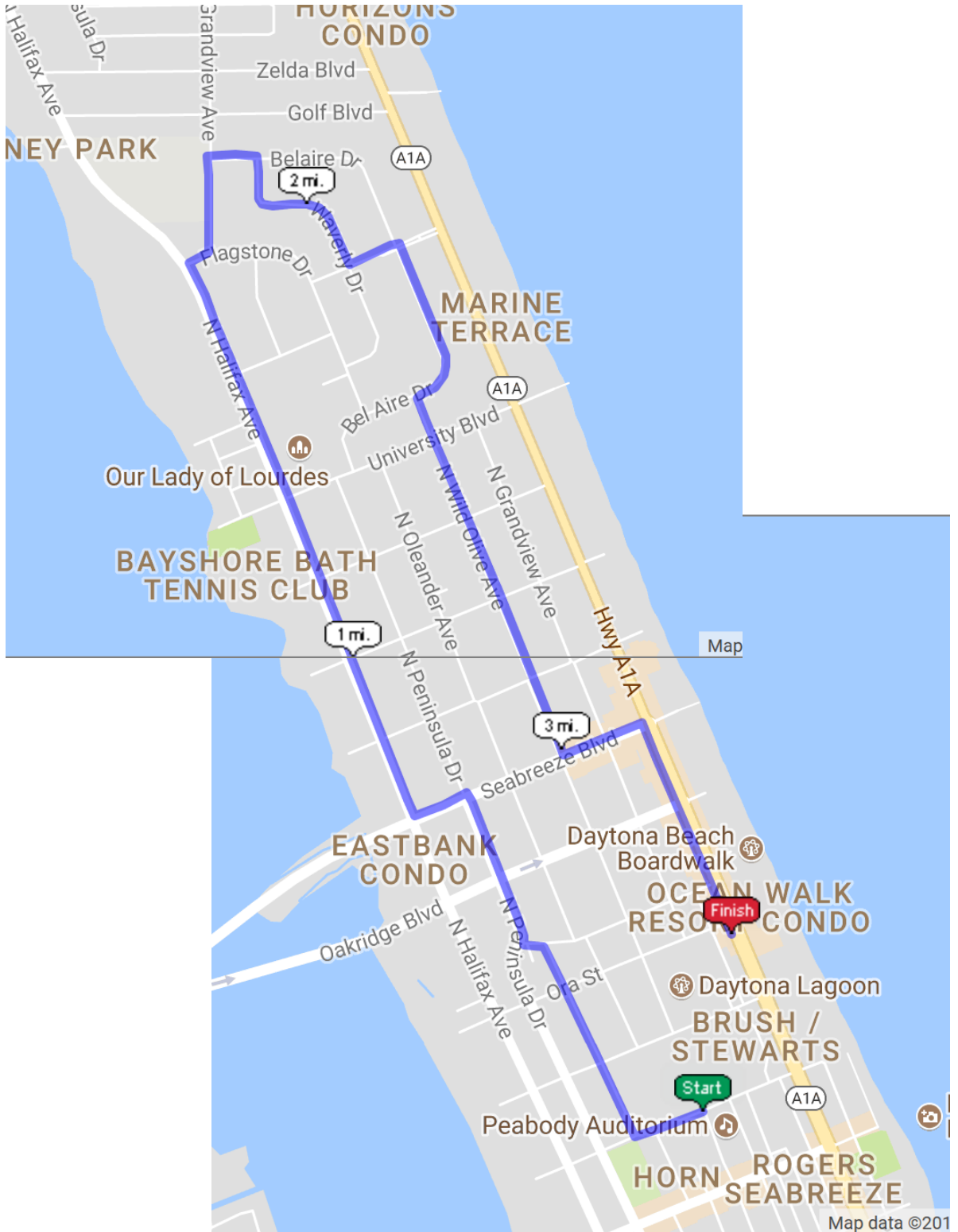
This will complete your 15KM extended walk. If you are completing the full 20KM walk, then use the 2d special map & directions when you reach the end of #31 on the 11KM directions!

DIRECTIONS FOR **20KM OPTION** - Y1134 – DAYTONA BEACH, FLORIDA
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FOR 20 KM ROUTE:

On 11K DIRECTIONS, AFTER #30,

AA. REMAIN on the Beach and continue **STRAIGHT** for another ~ ¼ mile to the Botefuhr Ave. beach ramp. (There is a yellow condo, a red lifeguard chair and a car entrance/exit booth at the ramp.)

BB. TURN RIGHT, and head up the slight hill to exit the beach at this point. At Atlantic Ave. (Rte A1A), carefully **CROSS** at the traffic light using the crosswalk on the left side.

CC. Continue **STRAIGHT** for 2 blocks to Schulte Ave. **TURN LEFT** on Schulte and walk for 2 block to the T intersection at Park St.

DD. TURN LEFT on Park for one short block to Schulte Ave. on your right.

EE. TURN RIGHT on Schulte for 2 blocks to the T-intersection at Grant Ave.

FF. TURN RIGHT on Grant for one block to a T-intersection at Boynton Blvd.

GG. TURN RIGHT on Boynton and walk around bend to Blais Ave. on the right.

HH. TURN RIGHT on Blais and walk 2 blocks back to Park Ave. Continue **STRAIGHT** across Park and then look for Blais Trail a short distance on your left side.

II. TURN LEFT on Blais Trail and follow this winding road through to S. Peninsula Dr.

JJ. TURN RIGHT on S. Peninsula. Walk along S. Peninsula for 5 blocks to Ocean Dunes Rd.

KK. TURN RIGHT on Ocean Dunes and bear to the left of the center island to **TURN LEFT** onto Cres Ridge Rd. for 1 block to Old Trail Rd.

LL. TURN RIGHT on Old Trail Rd. for 1 block to Ocean Dunes Terrace.

MM. TURN LEFT on Ocean Dunes Terrace for 1 block to Poinsettia Rd.

NN. TURN LEFT on Pointsetta for 1 block to Cres Ridge Rd.

OO. TURN RIGHT on Cres Ridge for 1 block to Wisteria Rd.

PP. TURN RIGHT on Wisteria and walk 2 blocks to Atlantic Ave / A1A.

QQ. TURN LEFT on A1A and walk 3 blocks to Bostwick Ave.

RR. CROSS Bostwick and **TURN LEFT** for 1 block to Ruger Pl.

SS. TURN RIGHT on Ruger Pl. for 1 block to Silver Beach Ave. There is a gas station on the corner on the right.

TT. TURN RIGHT and walk back to A1A. Your finish point is at the Silver Beach Club, diagonally across A1A. Use the lighted crosswalks to make your way back to the the hotel lobby! on the opposite corner.

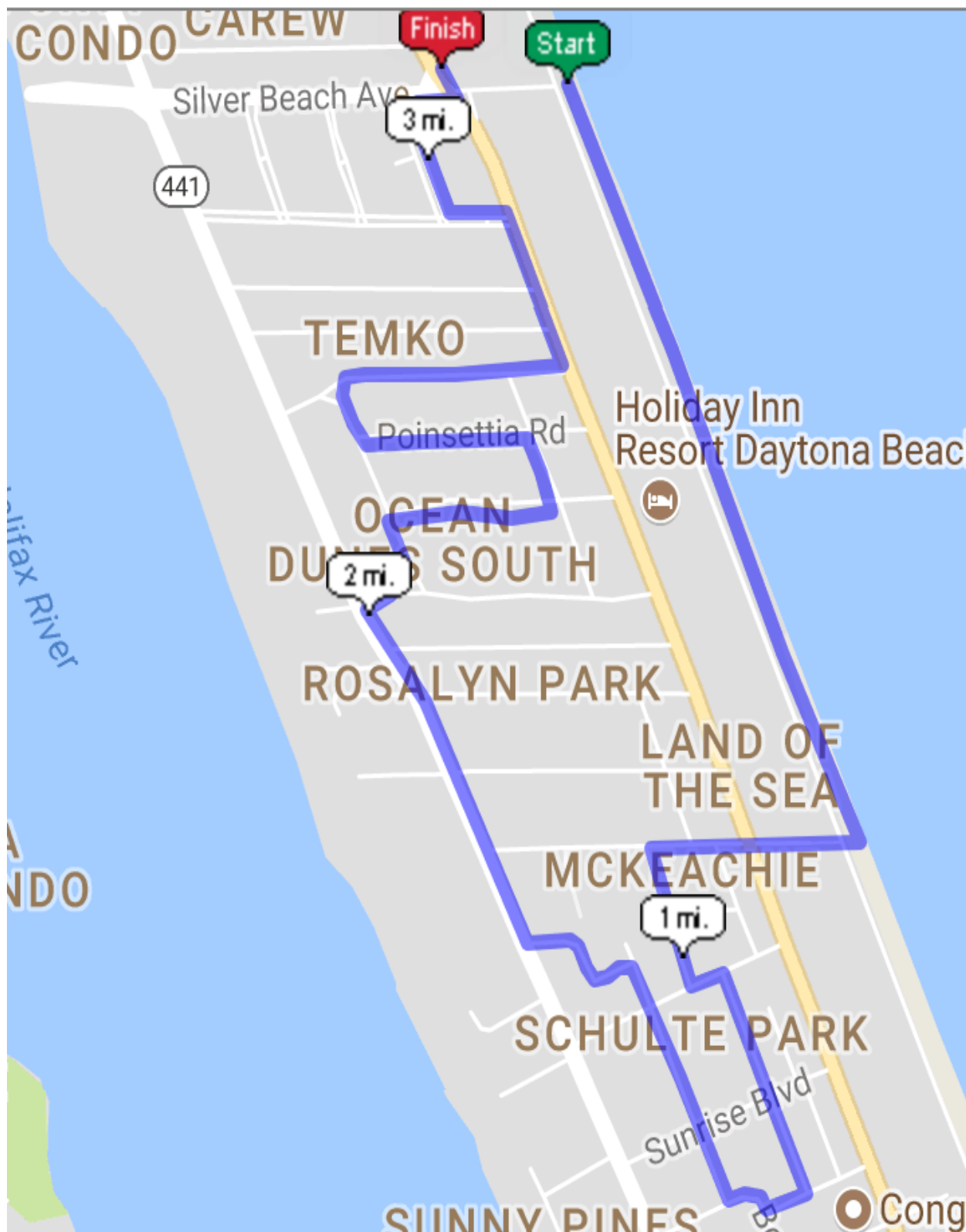
