Do NOT mix and match, for example, by registering using the OSB then completing your event using the PSB nor signing the PSB log sheet. The sponsoring club only receives credit for an OSB participation when an OSB registration has been completed online by entering your participation date, distances, and any special programs using the OSB.

Start Location: Tucker & Company Bakery Café, 148 South Baltimore St., Dillsburg, PA 17019. Hours are: Monday through Friday 8am to 6 pm; Saturday 9 am to 6 pm; Sunday 9 am to 1 pm.

Driving Directions:

From York, PA- take Rt. 74 through Dover to Rossville (5 mi.) Go straight at the signal light in Rossville onto Old York Rd (7mi.) Shortly after entering Dillsburg turn left at the Dillsburg Brethren in Christ Church onto E. Harrisburg St. At the light, turn left onto Baltimore Street. Tucker's is about 2.5 blocks up on the right. Free on-street parking is usually available.

From Gettysburg (the south) or Harrisburg (the north) – From US-15, turn east onto Rt 4040/E Harrisburg St. Go to the intersection with Baltimore St. Turn right. Tucker's is about 2.5 blocks up on the right. Free on-street parking is usually available.

Walk Descriptions: The town is named for Matthew Dill, an immigrant from County Monaghan, Ireland, who settled the town in 1740. The village became a center for local agriculture. During the Civil War's Gettysburg Campaign, Dillsburg was twice invaded by Confederate cavalry, first by Albert G. Jenkins's brigade, then by Maj. Gen. J.E.B. Stuart's division. Dill's Tavern, founded in the 1750s with a current building constructed between 1794 and 1819, and the Rev. Anderson B. Quay House are listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The walk passes through downtown, residential, and industrial sites.

Restrooms: When Tucker & Co is open there is, there is a restroom inside. Occasional restroom opportunities are noted throughout the directions.

Walk Completion and Credit: Be sure to log back into the OSB system to finish/complete your online registration after doing the event. The OSB system does not deduct any event fee from a participant's Event Bank until they have submitted event completion info including the date the event was walked, the distance walked, and the selection of applicable special programs that person is participating in. Nevertheless, a fee of \$2 for a downloaded PDF is deducted from the user's Event Bank when the PDF is downloaded. Later, any PDF fees are credited back to a user's Event Bank when he/she submits the event completion info as a paying for credit participant. Note, however, the \$2 coupon for the downloaded PDF will expire in 60 days.

These walk directions and maps may only be used in conjunction with a signed American Volkssport Association athletic waiver. All other uses are prohibited.

John McCoy Memorial Walk - Dillsburg, PA – 5k & 10k Directions

In case of emergency, dial 911

5K Directions:

1. Leave the start point, turn left on Baltimore Street to traffic signal at the town square. Turn RT to cross Baltimore, then LT left to cross Harrisburg St. Town clock is in front of you.
2. Continue walking on Baltimore Street (crossing Quay Alley, Church, Welty, Daisy Alley) until you reach Greenbriar Lane. You will pass Quay Park (city park) & the Dillsburg Post Office (17109) on your right. (Rest room is available at Dollar General. Request the key from the cashier.)

At Greenbrier Lane, the Dill Tavern is on the left side of Baltimore Street. Check the web site (<https://northernryorkhistorical.org/>) for visiting hours.

3. Turn RT on Greenbrier. Cross over Impala and BelAir. Walk a short distance to reach Harrisburg Pike.
4. Carefully cross Harrisburg Pike and continue straight crossing Clemens and passing Woodland Drive on left to Mumper Lane.
5. Cross & turn RT onto Mumper Lane **VERY CAREFULLY** walking on left (no sidewalk). Follow Mumper as it bends RT, passes the Dillsburg Public Library (rest rooms available when open), cross Clemens to Harrisburg Pike.

6. Cross & turn LT on Hbg. Pike to Church St crossing Welty & Rose.
7. Turn RT on Church Street, pass the historic Presbyterian Church, founded in 1745 (now home of the Compass Point Church) to Baltimore Street.
8. Carefully cross Baltimore Street in the crosswalk. Go straight, cross Bomar Alley & Second Street (no sign) to Third Street.
9. Walk straight to sidewalk at M&T Bank and turn LT on Third Street. Go to “T” intersection at Harrisburg St. (no sign).
10. Turn LT on Harrisburg Street to Second Street
11. Turn RT and cross Harrisburg to walk on S. Second St.
12. Continue on Second St. crossing Locust Alley (no sign) York, Keystone, Gettysburg, & Hanover St.
13. Bear LT on Franklin St. (no sign) passing the VFW on your left. Go a short distance to Bomar Alley.
14. Turn RT onto Bomar Alley, which turns into Butler St and bends left to end at stop sign on Baltimore St. (T intersection; no sign).
15. Turn LT on Baltimore Street and return to start point at Tucker & Co. Café Bakery.

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10 K Directions:

1. Leave the start point, turn left on Baltimore Street to traffic signal at the town square. Turn RT to cross Baltimore, then LT left to cross Harrisburg St. Town clock is in front of you.
2. Continue walking on Baltimore Street (crossing Church, Welty, Daisy Alley) until you reach Greenbriar Lane. You will pass Quay Park (city park) & the Dillsburg Post Office (17109) on your right. (Rest room is available at Dollar General. Request the key from the cashier.)

At Greenbrier Lane, the Dill Tavern is on the left side of Baltimore Street. Check the web site (<https://northernYorkhistorical.org/>) for visiting hours.
3. Turn RT on Greenbrier. Cross over Impala and BelAir. Walk a short distance to reach Harrisburg Pike
4. Turn LT to cross Greenbrier and then turn RT to cross Harrisburg Pike to continue walking on left side of Greenbrier to Clemens.
5. Turn LT onto Clemens Dr., crossing Wayside & Maple to Ridgeview Dr. (stop sign)
6. Turn LT on Ridgeview, pass Park Dr. on the right & cross Briar Ct. on the

- left. At the top of the hill, before the stop sign, turn RT on Park Dr.
7. Continue walking down the hill on Park Dr. to Ridgeview Dr.
8. Turn LT on Ridgeview, pass Clemens Dr. on the right (no sign) to Woodland Dr. (stop sign)
9. Turn LT on Woodland Dr. and then LT on first street which is Woodland. (The house on the left is number 462.) This is a loop going up the hill and back down. Walk past Woodland again & Ridgeview on the right and continue until Woodland comes to a stop sign at a “T” intersection which is Greenbrier.
10. Turn RT on Greenbrier to go to Clemens Dr.
11. Turn LT on Clemens, crossing Mumper Lane (public library half a block to the left on Mumper; rest rooms available when open). Then get to the right of Clemens Dr. to walk past Welty and Chestnut Hollow Dr. Pass the Dillsburg Heights Apts. and Autumn Woods Ct. complex to stop sign at Chestnut St. (no sign).
12. Turn RT to walk a short distance to York St. which is on the left side of the street. Turn LT & **carefully** cross Chestnut St. to walk on York St.
13. Walk on York St. to Baltimore St.

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14. Turn RT on Baltimore St & go to signal light at Harrisburg St. Cross & turn RT at the traffic signal to walk on the left side of Harrisburg St. Go half a block to Dill Alley (one way sign & brown house on right of alley.)
15. Turn LT into Dill Alley & walk to the historic Presbyterian Church (now called Compass Point Church) at Church St.
16. Turn sharp LT on Church St. (no sign) to Baltimore St.
17. Carefully cross Baltimore Street in the crosswalk. Go straight, cross Bomar Alley & Second Street (no sign) to Third Street.
18. Walk straight to sidewalk at M&T Bank and turn LT on Third Street. Go to “T” intersection at Harrisburg St. (no sign).
19. Turn LT on Harrisburg Street to Second Street.
20. Turn RT on S. Second St. crossing Locust Alley (no sign) York, Keystone, Gettysburg, Hanover, and bear LT on Franklin St. (no sign). Pass the VFW on your left and go to Bomar Alley (short distance)
21. Turn RT on Bomar Alley which turns into Butler St. Go to stop sign at Baltimore St. (no sign)
22. Carefully cross Baltimore Street, turn RT to walk on LT side of Baltimore. Cross Pheasant Ridge Rd to Oak Ave.
23. Turn LT on Oak and go to “T” intersection at Beechwood.
24. Turn RT on Beechwood and go to the second stop sign at Pheasant Ridge Rd. Beechwood turns into Quail Dr.
25. Continue straight on Quail Dr. to reach Pheasant Ridge Rd again
26. Turn RT on Pheasant Ridge Rd. and go to the stop sign at Baltimore St.
27. Turn RT on Baltimore St. At Franklin St. use the crosswalk to cross Baltimore Street, turn right, cross Franklin and continue walking on Baltimore St. to the start point, Tucker & Company Bakery Café at 148 S. Baltimore St.
