1.	Walk begins at front door facing the street. Use map on page 2 if turning LEFT; Pg 3 if RIGHT. Use both maps for 11K.
2.	Straight to sidewalk on Augusta St. Directions written for LEFT Turn first.
3.	Left on the sidewalk. <i>If Right, go to #20.</i>
Walk on sidewalks or facing traffic	
4.	Left on Cureton St. 1 st left. Pass Stewart St.
5.	Right on McCuen St. next right.
6.	Left on Stewart St. The street circles to the right, passes Oregon St., and becomes East Augusta Place.
7.	Left on Augusta St. Pass Oak Crest.
8.	David Traxler had what The Greenville News called “the blood of the Old South” through Traxler’s veins. But he was also a New South entrepreneur with boundless energy, remarkable foresight and, for some years, equally remarkable business success. He arrived in Greenville in 1906, when he was in his mid-20s. A fervent Clemson supporter, he immediately began corresponding with African hunters to obtain a tiger for the college campus. In Greenville he began small, dealing in insurance, real estate and collections. In 1909, however, his father joined him, and together they leased an impressive office on the second floor of the Beattie Building at the corner of Washington and Main Streets. For Traxler Park they photographed every listed property and presented the photograph—for free!—to clients. They ran weekly columns of sale properties in newspapers, published brochures listing especially desirable locations, and circulated 1,000 postcards weekly to potential buyers. Traxler didn’t restrict his activities to real estate. In 1908 he began developing land near Walhalla in order to generate electric power for Toccoa, Ga. He was vice president of the Arnold Department Store of Spartanburg, a partner in Greenville’s Wise Cigar Co., had an auctioneering business, ran a small mail

	order business in corn seed and advertised stump removal by dynamite.
9.	Left on E. Tallulah Dr. into old Traxler Park area.
10.	Right at dead end on Rock Creek Dr.
11.	Right Mount Vista Ave.
12.	Curve slight Right onto Byrd Blvd. to Augusta St. Note Traxler Park engraved stone at right.
13.	Cross and Right on Augusta St.
14.	Left on W. Tallulah Dr.
15.	Right at dead end on W. Augusta Pl.
16.	Curve Right uphill on W. Augusta Pl.
17.	Left on Westminster Dr.
18.	Right on Augusta Dr. Cross Augusta St. at light.
19.	Left to the finish at Starbucks.
20.	Continue along Augusta St. crossing Faris Rd. Use map on page 3.
21.	Right at E. Faris Rd.
22.	Left at Longview Terrace.
23.	Right at Lanneau Dr. Sign partially hidden.
24.	Left at McPherson Ln.
25.	Right at McDaniel Ct.
26.	Right at McDaniel Ave.
27.	Cross & Right at Crescent Ave.
28.	Left at Belmont Ave. (1 st left)
29.	Right at Cleveland St.
30.	Right at Fairview Ave.
31.	Left at McIverSt. Ave.
32.	Right at Pine Forest Dr.
33.	Right at Crescent Ave.
34.	Right at Fairview Ave. at end.
35.	Left at Crescent Ave. (next left)
36.	Left at McDaniel Ave.
37.	Left at Lanneau Dr. Continue straight at 4 way intersection.
38.	Right at E. Faris Rd.
39.	Left at Augusta St.
40.	Continue to Starbucks crossing Faris Rd.
