RICHLAND RIVERFRONT RECREATION TRAIL INFORMATION

This seasonal bike riding event is on a paved recreation trail system along the Columbia River in Richland. One small portion is along a residential street and another small portion parallels a road in a separate bike lane, but most of the route is on a paved recreation trail. Junctions are generally well signed. The route is a combination walk/bike trail except for one portion where the bike trail is separate from the walking trail. For that part, be sure to ride on the bike trail not the walking trail.

RESTROOM INFORMATION

Restrooms are available at the starting point in Columbia Point Park and in the city parks along the trail.

SACAJAWEA HERITAGE TRAIL INFORMATION

There is a much longer paved recreation loop trail in the Tri-Cities area that connects with the Richland Riverfront/Levee Trail. The Sacajawea Heritage Trail makes a complete loop on both sides of the river in Kennewick and Pasco and is 30K (18.6 miles) in length. It is not part of this event. If you ride the Heritage Trail, be sure to have water, sunscreen and a good map of the loop trail system as much of it is open and unshaded and there are many connecting trails to the main Heritage Trail that may be confusing at times.

Thanks for participating and we hope you enjoy your bike ride along Richland's Riverfront Trail.

CENTRAL WASHINGTON SUN STRIDERS - RATED 1A**

DRIVING DIRECTIONS to COLUMBIA POINT PARK start

46.15'47.89" N 119.14'47.92" W

1. From I-82, take exit 102 (I-182 toward Richland/Pasco).
2. Take Exit 5B off I-182. You will loop around to George Washington Way.
3. Turn **RIGHT** at the first stop light on Columbia Point Drive.
4. Follow Columbia Point Drive to the end (past golf course, residential area).
5. Park on the left just before the turnaround at the river.

BIKE RIDE INSTRUCTIONS

IN CASE OF EMERGENCY - CALL 911

1. Facing the river at the turnaround, turn **LEFT** on the asphalt trail. The river will be on your right.
2. **CROSS** in front of the boat launch and continue on the trail past the marina.
3. **CONTINUE** on the trail into Richland City Park.
4. **CROSS** the boat launch at Howard Amon Park. Stay on the trail that is between the boat launch parking lot and the river.
5. **PROCEED** up the small hill, to the trail on the dike.
6. Just after the trail makes a right turn at River Rd (unmarked), the bike trail diverges from the ped trail. Stay **LEFT** on the bike trail.
7. **CONTINUE** into Leslie Groves Park.
8. At Snyder boat launch, the bike and ped trails come back together.
9. At Ferry Street (unmarked), the trail turns **LEFT** onto the street for one block.
10. At Harris Ave. (unmarked) turn **RIGHT**.
11. At Sprout Road, turn **RIGHT**.
12. At road end, turn **LEFT** back on the Riverfront Trail.
13. Trail will **ANGLE LEFT** away from the river to the USS Triton Park (sub conning tower).
14. Turn **AROUND** and return on the route to your start point.

Be sure to log back into the OSB system (my.ava.org) to finish/complete your online registration after doing the event. The OSB system does not deduct any fee from an event bank until they have submitted event completion info including the date the event was ridden, the distance ridden, and the selection of applicable special programs that bike rider is participating in. (Nevertheless, a fee of \$2 for a downloaded pdf is deducted from the user's Event Bank when the pdf is downloaded. Later, any pdf fees are credited back to a bike rider's Event Bank when he/she submits the event completion info as a paying for credit bike rider.) The \$2 "coupon" for the downloaded pdf expires in 60 days.
