

BRUNSWICK SEASONAL 5K WALK

1. Exit Hannaford's and turn left, past the front of the store to Elm Street.
2. Go straight across Elm Street to Middle Street, follow to Pleasant Street.
3. Cross Pleasant Street and go straight to Abbey Road.
4. Follow Abbey Road until you see the fire station on your right.
5. Turn right at the fire station and continue to Town Hall Plaza and to Main Street (use caution passing through).
6. Turn right on Main Street, carefully crossing Pleasant Street and continue straight ahead.
7. Cross the railroad tracks, passing Station Avenue on the right. Continue up the hill where Main Street takes a slight jog to the right. The First Parish Church will be in the intersection on your left. On your right will be the Joshua Chamberlain House & Museum. General Chamberlain was a hero at Gettysburg during the Civil War. He witnessed the surrender of the Confederate Army by General Robert E. Lee to General Grant at the Appomattox Court House in Virginia. His grave is in the cemetery you will pass at #11. As you pass through the intersection, you will see a statue of him on the left, the edge of the Bowdoin College campus.
8. Follow Main Street to College Street on the left. Turn left on College Street. On the left are small, brick gates. Turn into Bowdoin College at the second gate (the name on the gate should be Packard Gate) and go straight through the campus.
9. On the far left is the Hawthorne-Longfellow Library. The next building on the left is Hubbard Hall (the original Bowdoin Library), which houses the Peary-MacMillan Arctic Museum.

10. Continue through the Bowdoin College campus to Massachusetts Hall, where the path splits. Take the right fork straight to Route 24/Bath Road.
11. Turn right as you leave the Bowdoin campus onto Bath Road and continue straight to the intersection with Sills Drive (Harpwell Road) on the right. Cross Sills Drive at the crosswalk and continue straight ahead. Pine Grove Cemetery will be on the right (the grave of Joshua Chamberlain is near the front, right side).
12. Turn around and return to the intersection of Sills Drive and Bath Road, at the traffic light.
13. Carefully cross Bath Road straight ahead to Federal Street.
14. Follow Federal Street downhill. On the right will be the Harriet Beecher Stowe House, where the author wrote *Uncle Tom's Cabin*.
15. Turn left onto School Street and follow it to the stop sign at Park Row.
16. Turn left onto Park Row.
17. Turn left onto Green Street.
18. At the end of Green Street, turn left onto Federal Street, staying on the left sidewalk.
19. At the end of Federal Street, turn left onto Mason Street.
20. Turn left onto Main Street.
21. Walk several blocks until you reach Keith Field Jewelers, on your left, at 147 Maine Street.
22. At the traffic light in front of Keith Field, cross Main Street. You will be standing in front of Wyler's store at the corner of Maine and Pleasant Streets.
23. Cross Pleasant Street at the traffic light and turn right to follow Pleasant Street past the Bath Savings Institution.

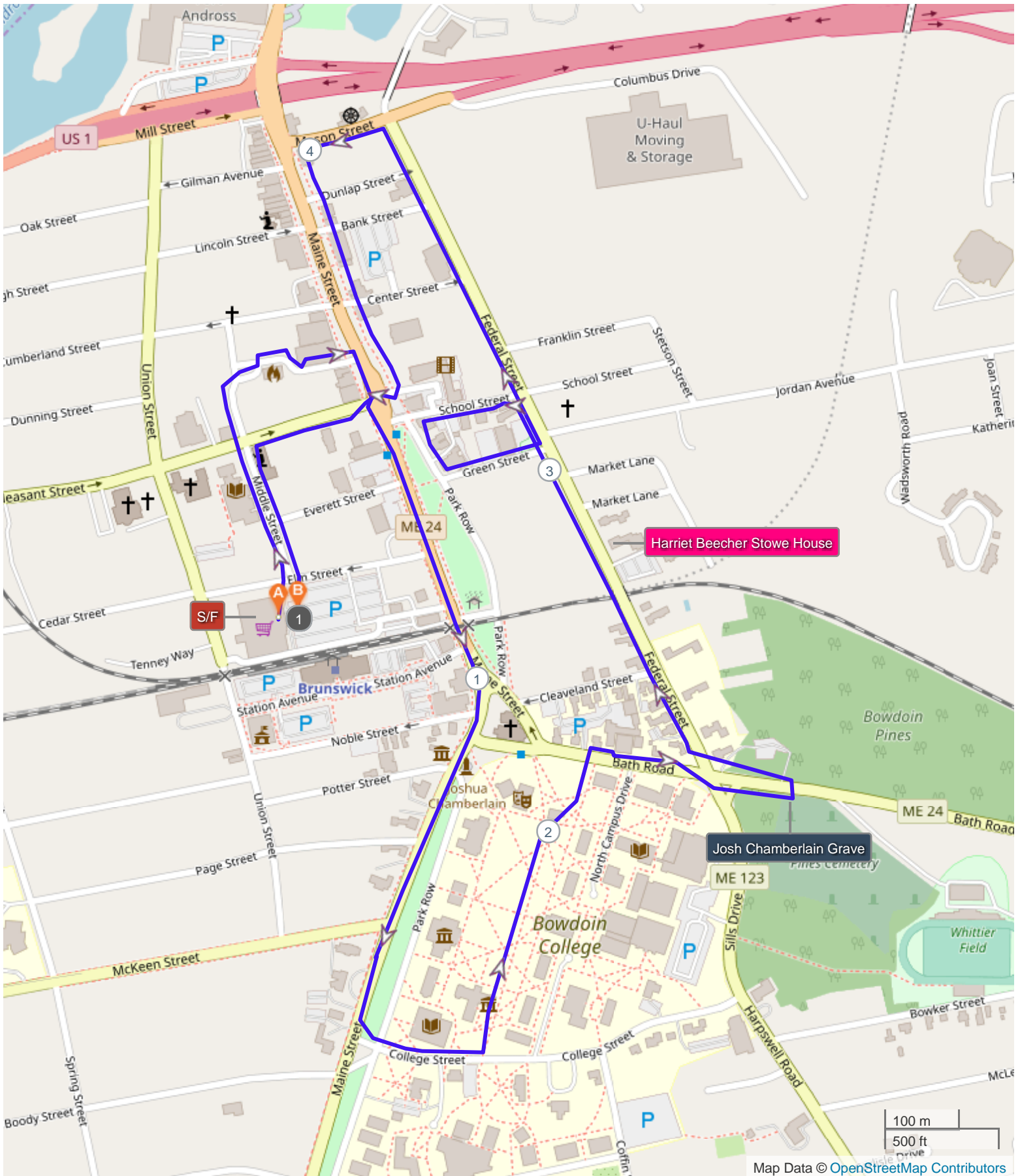
24. Cross Middle Street at the crosswalk and turn left onto Middle Street, passing the Curtis Memorial Library entrance on your right.

25. Continue straight on Middle Street until you reach Elm Street.

26. Cross Elm Street to return to the starting point at Hannaford's.

BRUNSWICK SEASONAL WALK 10K HISTORICAL WALK

1. Exit Hannaford's and turn left, past the front of the store to Elm Street.
2. Go straight across Elm Street to Middle Street, and follow to Pleasant Street.
3. Cross Pleasant Street and go straight to Abbey Road.
4. Follow Abbey Road until you see the fire station on your right.
5. Turn right at the fire station and continue to Town Hall Plaza and to Main Street (use caution passing through).
6. Turn right on Main Street, carefully crossing Pleasant Street and continue straight ahead.
7. Cross the railroad tracks, passing Station Avenue on the right. Continue up the hill where Main Street takes a slight jog to the right. The First Parish Church will be in the intersection on your left. On your right will be the Joshua Chamberlain House & Museum. General Chamberlain was a hero at Gettysburg during the Civil War. He witnessed the surrender of the Confederate Army by General Robert E. Lee to General Grant at the Appomattox Court House in Virginia. His grave is in the cemetery you will pass at #19. As you pass through the intersection, you will see a statue of him on the left, at the edge of the Bowdoin College campus.
8. Follow Main Street to McKeen Street at the traffic light, and turn right onto McKeen, walking on the right sidewalk.
9. When you reach the 4-way intersection with Spring Street, turn left to carefully cross McKeen Street onto Spring Street. Follow Spring Street to Boody Street.
10. Turn left onto Boody Street.
11. Follow Boody Street until it ends back on Main Street.

12. Turn left onto Main Street.
13. Continue a short distance on Main Street until you come to a crosswalk just past a large, gray Victorian house at 254 Main Street, on your left.
14. Press the button to cross Main Street in the crosswalk onto College Street.
15. Walk down College Street, crossing a small street named Park Row. On the left is the Hawthorne-Longfellow Library.
16. After passing the library, you will come to a set of small, brick gates. These are actually the second pair of gates you will come to (the name on the gate should be Packard Gate). Turn left to enter Bowdoin College and go straight through the campus.
17. The Hawthorne-Longfellow Library will now be on your left. The next building on your left is Hubbard Hall (the original Bowdoin Library), which houses the Peary-MacMillan Arctic Museum. If you look all the way up to the top of the building, you will see Maine's only gargoyle.
18. Continue through the Bowdoin College campus to Massachusetts Hall (the oldest building on campus, completed in 1802), where the path splits. Take the right fork straight to Route 24/Bath Road.
19. Turn right as you leave the Bowdoin campus onto Bath Road and continue straight to the intersection with Sills Drive (Harpwell Road) on the right. Cross Sills Drive at the crosswalk and continue straight ahead. Pine Grove Cemetery will be on the right (the grave of Joshua Chamberlain is near the front, right side).
20. Turn around and return to the intersection of Sills Drive and Bath Road at the traffic light.
21. Carefully cross Bath Road and go straight ahead to Federal Street.

22. Follow Federal Street downhill. On the right, at 63 Federal Street, will be the Harriet Beecher Stowe House, where the author wrote *Uncle Tom's Cabin*.
23. At the end of Federal Street, turn left onto Mason Street.
24. Go straight down Mason Street to end at Main Street.
25. Cross Main Street at the crosswalk and turn right, staying on Main Street.
26. Follow Main Street over the highway (Route 1). Pass the large mill (Fort Andross) on your left to the large green bridge (dam and falls) on left.
27. Cross the bridge to Summer Street in Topsham.
28. Turn left on Summer Street and follow it to Bridge Street (walk with caution on this narrow street).
29. Turn left on Bridge Street downhill to a small walking bridge on the left
30. Cross the walking bridge to Mill Street. The crosswalk is at the end of the walking bridge. Carefully cross Mill Street. This is a very busy intersection.
31. Turn left onto Mill Street.
32. Walk a very short distance on Mill Street and you will come to Cushing Street on the right.
33. Turn right onto Cushing Street and follow it to Pleasant Street.
34. Carefully cross Pleasant Street in the crosswalk (another busy street) and turn right on Pleasant Street. Follow Pleasant Street to Spring Street on the left.
35. Turn left on Spring Street. Follow Spring Street to Weymouth Street on the left.
36. Turn left on Weymouth Street. Follow Weymouth Street to Union Street.

37. Turn left on Union and cross the railroad tracks to Pleasant Street.
38. Carefully cross Pleasant Street to Gilman Street on the right.
39. Turn right on Gilman Street. Follow it to Main Street.
40. Turn right on Maine Street to Elm Street.
41. Turn right on Elm Street back to the starting point at Hannaford's.

Walk Completion and Credit

Be sure to log back into the OSB system to finish/complete your online registration after doing the event. The OSB system does not

deduct any event fee from a participant's Event Bank until they have submitted event completion info including the date the event was walked, the distance walked, and the selection of applicable special programs that person is participating in. Nevertheless, a fee of \$2 for a downloaded PDF is deducted from the Event Bank when the PDF is downloaded. Later, any PDF fees are credited back to a user's Event Bank when they submit the event completion info as a paying for credit participant. Note, however, that the \$2 coupon for the downloaded PDF expires in 60 days.
