

Selinsgrove Seasonal

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Start Location: Rear of 100 W Pine St, Selinsgrove PA 17870.

Google Maps Coordinate: 40.799816, -76.863939

Driving Directions: Follow US Route 11/15 north from Harrisburg Area to where the thruway ends and traffic lights start.

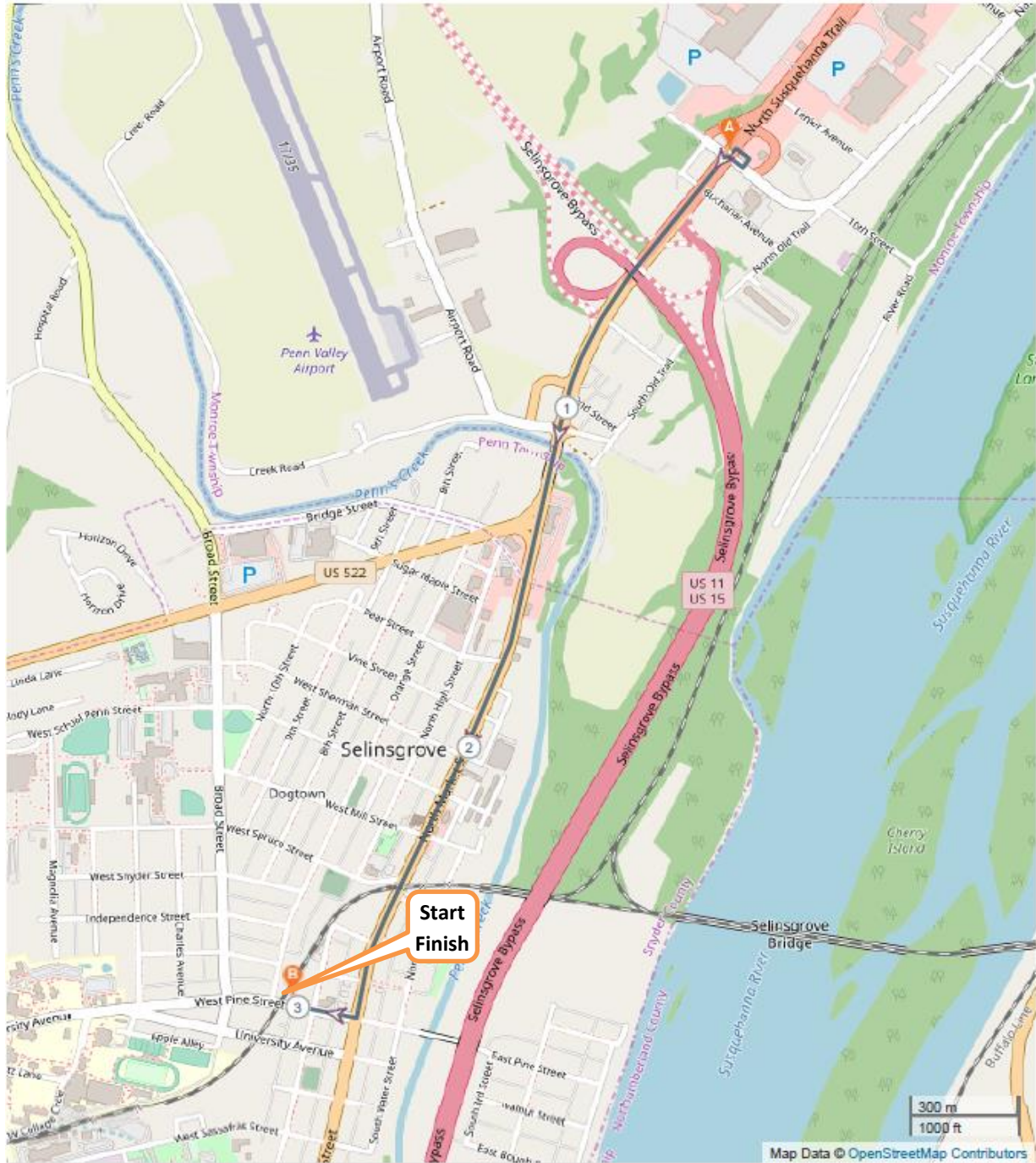
Turn Right at first traffic light into Sheetz Gas Station. They have public restrooms. If not availing yourself of the restrooms, turn right at green "Susq Vly Mall" sign. Take the jughandle that circles Sheetz.

Leave Sheetz at traffic light and turn Left toward Selinsgrove.

Go straight into Selinsgrove. Continue straight after crossing metal bridge. You are now on Market St.

Turn Right on Pine St.

Turn Right into parking lot at rear of Police Station. Trail will start here. There is an ATM on opposite side of alley.

Selinsgrove 5K walk directions

These walk directions and maps may only be used in conjunction with a signed American Volkssport Association athletic waiver. All other uses are prohibited.

1. Turn **Left** out of Selinsgrove Police Department parking lot to High Street. **Cross** High, Veteran Memorial is on corner and if Library is open there are restrooms in basement. Turn **Left** on High Street to Snyder Street. You will pass the Old Selinsgrove Train Station on your left.
2. Turn **Right** on Snyder. Carefully cross Market Street to All Saints Church started in 1899. Turn **Left** on Market to E. Spruce Street and the Selinsgrove Hotel. Turn **Right** on Spruce. Turn **Right** at Water Street. Turn **Left** at Snyder Street to walk into Pump House Park. Walk toward the Creek and then turn **Right** toward the Gazebo. Turn **Left** at Alley continuing as the alley bears to the right. Turn **Right** at Water Street and return to Snyder. Turn **Left** at Snyder and return to Market.
3. Turn **Left** at Market Street. *#123 is the original home of Simon Snyder, the only three term governor of Pennsylvania. The county was named after him. The stone mansion at #121 was his next home. In addition to being the governor's home, the mansion served as a station on the Underground Railroad, rescuing slaves*

escaping from the South. They were brought into the mansion through a tunnel which ran all the way to Penns Creek. The Selins Grove Brewery is in the basement of this building.

4. Turn **Left** at Pine Street and continue across bridge to the Isle of Que, the oldest part of town. *It gets its name from the hairpiece, a "Que", worn by the French soldiers who were billeted on the island. The isle is about 5 miles in length and most of it was cultivated fields but now there are many river-view homes instead.*
5. Turn **Left** at Second Street. Turn **Right** at E. Chestnut Street. Turn **Right** at Front Street. *The house at #6 (beyond Pine) was originally the barn of an old farm. In a room on the second floor of the house at #18, Elsie Singmaster wrote her novel "Isle of Que". The house at #116 at the corner of Bough Street was originally an Indian trading post. The double foundation is still visible. The house on the opposite corner, at #200 was originally the first Roman Catholic Church for the Irish Catholic laborers who built the Pennsylvania Canal, remnants of which are still visible along US 11-15.*
6. Turn **Right** at Bough Street. Turn **Right** at Third Street. *The Old Georgian style brick building at #18 and #20 Third Street was originally a bakery serving the needs of the residents of the island.*
7. Turn **Left** at Pine Street and cross the bridge.

8. You will pass the Old Selinsgrove Firehouse that is now an Antique Store at Water Street. Turn **Left** on Market Street. *The Masonic Building opposite the post office is the old Trinity Lutheran Church for many years referred to as the “college church”.*

9. Turn **Right** at Bough Street. *Sharon Lutheran Church is on the corner and First Lutheran Church Cemetery is in the rear, which contains many old gravestones as well as the monument marking the grave of Simon Snyder.*

10. Turn **Right** on High Street. Turn **Left** on University Avenue. *Many of the homes west of Broad Street are owned by the university or its related entities. The house at #413 is the home of the Chaplain to the university and contains the most magnificent fireplace of any home in town. The university president lives at Pine Lawn at #501.*

11. At the first left into college (there is a multidirectional signpost on the right)



- cross street, then bear left to take the first diagonal sidewalk on the right side of the street and go up the steps to the first building. *This is the oldest on campus, Selinsgrove Hall, built in 1853 by the generosity of the residents of Selinsgrove.*

12. Walk **clockwise** around the building to the back and then turn **Left** to take the sidewalk to the next building, Seibert Hall, built in



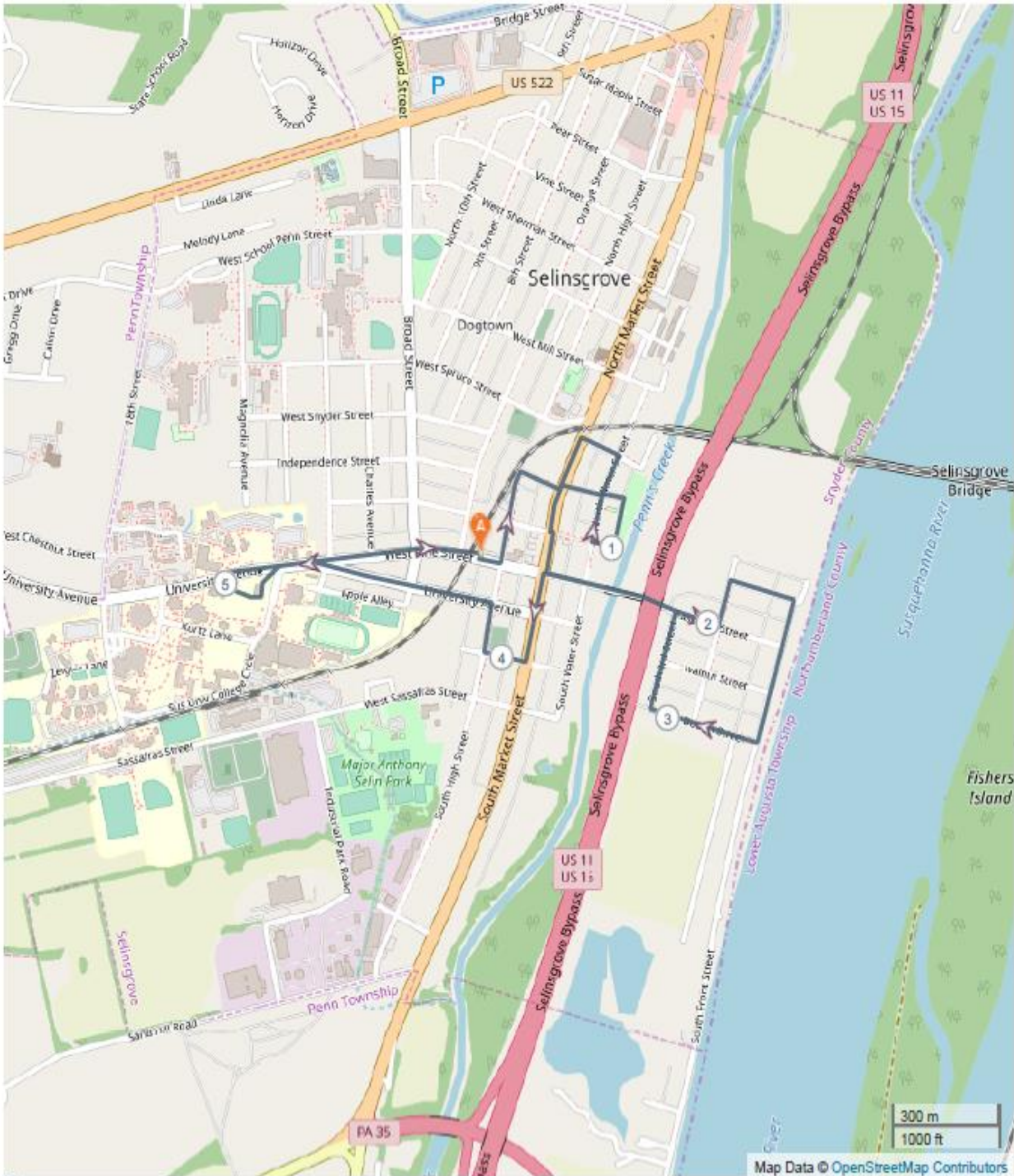

13. Return to Street. Turn **Right**. You will see a historic marker about Susquehanna University.

14. Continue to the crosswalk and turn **Left** to cross street. Turn **Right** to walk along left side of street back to the parking lot at Liberty Alley.

Event related assistance:
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1. Turn Left out of parking lot to High Street. Police Department is at corner. Turn Right and cross Pine Street. Continue on High. Cross University Avenue
2. Turn Right on University Avenue. Many of the homes west of Broad Street are owned by the university or its related entities. The house at #413 is the home of the Chaplain to the university and contains the most magnificent fireplace of any home in town. The university president lives at Pine Lawn at #501.
3. At the first street, cross and turn Left into Susquehanna University. Take the first diagonal sidewalk on the right side of the street and go up the steps to first building. (There is a multi directional signpost on the right).



This is the oldest on campus, Selinsgrove Hall, built in 1853 by the generosity of the residents of Selinsgrove.

4. Walk clockwise around the building to the back and turn Left to take the sidewalk to the next building, Seibert Hall built in 1901.



5. Turn Right to return to the street (now called Pine Street). Turn Left and walk to 18th Street. Turn Right to Cross Pine. Walk on 18th Street until you see a yellow Cross Walk sign and Woodlyn Drive sign at Harris Estates on the left side of street. Turn Right onto Seal lane and walk carefully along the brim past the Middle School.
6. Turn Right on Magnolia Avenue at the "Speed Limit 15" sign to walk behind the football field.
7. Turn Left at Independence Street. Turn Right at Susquehanna Avenue.
8. Turn Left at W. Chestnut Street. Turn Left at Broad Street. Turn Right at Sherman Street.
9. Turn Left on Woodruff Avenue. Turn Right on W. Vine Street. Turn Right on Ninth

Street. Turn Left on W. Mill Street and past St. Pauls UCC Cemetery.

10. Turn Left on N. High Street. Turn Right on Pear Street. Turn Right on Market Street. #123 is the original home of Simon Snyder, the only three term governor of Pennsylvania. The stone mansion at #121 is open to the public. In addition to being the governor's home, the mansion served as a station on the Underground Railroad, rescuing slaves escaping from the South. They were brought into the mansion through a tunnel which ran all the way to Penns Creek.
11. Turn Left at Pine Street and continue across bridge to the Isle of Que, the oldest part of town. It gets its name from the hairpiece, a "Que", worn by the French soldiers who were billeted on the island. The isle is about 5 miles in length and most of it is cultivated fields for Furman Foods, Inc.
12. Turn Left at Second Street. Turn Right at E. Chestnut Street – when you get to Front Street, if you look to your left, there had been an old cabin left over from the Indian trading post days.
13. Turn Right to walk along Front Street. The house at #6 (beyond Pine) was originally the barn of an old farm. In a room on the second floor of the house at #18, Elsie Singmaster wrote her novel "Isle of Que". The house at #116 at the corner of Bough Street was originally an Indian trading post.

The double foundation is still visible. The house on the opposite corner, at #200 was originally the first Roman Catholic Church for the Irish Catholic laborers who built the Pennsylvania Canal, remnants of which are still visible along US 11-15.

14. Turn Right at Bough Street. Turn Right at Third Street. The Old Georgian style brick building at #18 and #20 Third Street was originally a bakery serving the needs of the residents of the island.
15. Turn Left at Pine and cross the bridge.
16. You will pass the Old Selinsgrove Firehouse that is now an Antique Store at Water Street. Turn Left on Market Street. The Masonic Building opposite the post office is the old Trinity Lutheran Church for many years referred to as the "college church".
17. Turn Right at Bough Street. Sharon Lutheran Church is on the corner and their cemetery is in the rear, which contains many old gravestones as well as the monument marking the grave of Simon Snyder.

19. Turn Left to walk by Police Station and continue back to the parking lot at Liberty Alley.
