Lake Murray State Park (Love/Carter Counties) WWC
Saturday – 8:00 AM to 10:00 AM; finish by 1:00 PM
Startpoint: **Lake Murray State Park Visitor's Center 13528 Scenic Hwy 77
Ardmore, Oklahoma 73401**

Directions: From I-35 Take exit 24 continue east until you reach the park. The visitor's center will be on the right just past the stop sign. There will have a table set up in that area.

Lake Murray State Park is Oklahoma's first and largest state park consisting of 12,500 acres of forested, rolling hills around beautiful Lake Murray. Take a walk on some of the most diverse trails in Oklahoma at the beautiful Lake Murray State Park. The 5 and 10K walks will include both Love and Carter Counties.

- Parking pass is required **There is a \$10 parking fee at Oklahoma parks. (Vehicles with an Oklahoma or Oklahoma tribal license plate will receive a 20 percent discount, making their pass just \$8 per vehicle for a single day.)**
- Parking is free for:
 - Individuals over the age of 62- must show proof
 - Honorably discharged veterans -must show proof
 - Guest of the cabins or lodge
- (You can get the parking pass at the visitor's center the day of the walk.)
You can find more information on the parking at travelok.com.

Lake Murray State Park is approx. 1 ¼ hours from Oklahoma City; and 3 + hours from Tulsa. Restrooms and water available at the startpoint. Leashed pets are allowed on walk. Route is rated: 2B; Some Moderate hills or stairs on well groomed trails with very few obstacles; hard for Strollers and Wheelchairs.

Madill, OK (Marshall County) Tulsa Walking Club
Saturday – 1:00 PM to 3:00 PM; finish by 4:30 PM.
Startpoint: **Gazebo on The Marshall County Courthouse grounds; located at 100 Plaza, in Madill, Oklahoma 73446.** Driving Directions: From Lake Murray State Park to Madill, Oklahoma, it is approximately half an hour. Proceed North on State Highway 77S in the park; when you reach State Highway 70, turn Right (East) and continue to Madill. In Madill, State Highway 70 becomes North 1st Street; continue on North 1st Street (it will curve to the Right (South), until you

come to E. Main Street, and turn Left at the stop light. The Courthouse is straight ahead. (approx.. 40 minute drive). Circle to the gazebo on the courthouse lawn (start point location).

Madill was originally named for a Saint Louis-San Francisco Railway lawyer, George Alexander Madill. In 1945 Dennison Dam was built creating Lake Texoma. Today the city of 4,608 population, is a recreation center supporting the popular Lake. The week-long National Sand Bass Festival, happens each June.

Water will be available at the Startpoint; however, restrooms are NOT. There are some facilities along the walk route. Route is rated: 1A; medium difficulty for wheelchairs and strollers.

Durant, OK (Bryan County) Tulsa Walking Club
Sunday – 9:00 AM to Noon; finish by 2:30 PM

Startpoint: **Dixon Durant Park Shelter, 1020 N. 10th Avenue, Durant, Oklahoma 74701** Traveling from Madill startpoint, return to State Highway 70, and turn Left (South). You will stay on State Highway 70 as it curves to the left (East), and will arrive in Durant. State Highway 70 becomes Main Street in Durant. STAY on Main Street. (Hwy 70 will split off) Continue on Main Street to N. 10th Avenue, and turn Left (North). Continue on N. 10th Avenue to W. Walnut Street. The park is at N. 10th Avenue and W. Walnut Street. Proceed to the only shelter. Watch for TWC signs. Durant is approx. 45 minutes from Madill.

Durant, is the county seat of Bryan County, and known as the Magnolia Capital of Oklahoma. Durant serves as the capital city and headquarters of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma. The city was founded by Dixon Durant, a Choctaw who lived in the area, after the MK&T railroad came through the Indian Territory in the early 1870s. It became the county seat of Bryan County in 1907 after Oklahoma statehood. Durant is also home to Southeastern Oklahoma State University.

Restrooms and water available at the Startpoint, and leashed pets are allowed on walk. Route is rated: 1A; medium difficulty for wheelchairs and strollers. Special Programs Credit: **"D" in the A-Z program, Rock Around the Clock and Veteran's Memorials.**

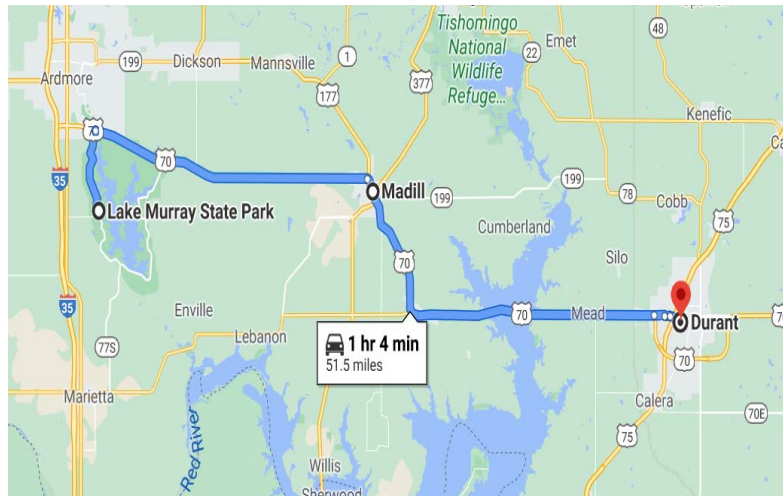
