

Directions: From Harrisburg:

If using Market St Bridge, go straight up hill under railroad bridges. Continue on Market Street about 2 miles. Turn Right on N 27th St. **House is tan and half way up the hill on the right side in the first block.**

If using the Harvey Taylor Bridge, continue on bypass, bear Left at the 21st St South Exit. Continue to traffic light. Turn Left onto 21st St. Continue to Traffic light at Market St. Turn Right. At N 27th St, continue from above **

From I-83 or Route 581: Take the Camp Hill Exit. Pass the Camp Hill Shopping Center and bear Right at Market St (Friendly's). Go past the traffic light at 29th St and turn Left at the next street (N 27th St), continue from above **



Other year round events in the area: Harrisburg Capital Walk (about 5 miles) Wildwood Lake (about 10 miles), Hershey Town and Hershey Bull Frog Valley Walk (about 20 miles), Mechanicsburg (about 6 miles), Lebanon (about 25 miles), Carlisle (about 24 miles off of I-81), Mifflin (west of Harrisburg off of Route 322 about 40 miles).

Start Point: Home of Pat Eby, 19 N 27th St, Camp Hill PA 17011

Walk Start Time: Between 8:00 am and 1:00 pm; finish by 4 pm.

AVA Special Program: A to Z - C for Camp Hill, State - Pennsylvania

KSVA Special County Challenge: Cumberland County

Eligibility: Everyone is welcome to participate. Walk at your own pace. Runners are welcome. Children 12 and under must be accompanied by an adult. There is a 5 or 10K trail.

Trail: Most of the trail follows the established Goddard Hiking Trail around the borough. There are some variations to that trail because it wasn't long enough. It is a walking trail, not a real hiking trail. Parking will be free, but it will be along the streets surrounding the house. Please bring water to carry.

Registration and Fees: These events are Free to those who wish to participate without IVV Credit. IVV Credit is \$3.00 for event credit. There is not an award for this event. Children under 12 can walk for credit without charge.

Procedure: AVA policy requires that every participant, fee or non-fee, must sign an insurance waiver and obtain a numbered start card which is carried while on the trail. At the end of the walk, the start card is turned in and IVV books are stamped for official credit, if the fee has been paid. The trail may be walked a second time on the same day using the same start card at no additional cost.

Conditions: The event will be held regardless of the weather. There will be no littering. Wildlife and plant life are not to be disturbed. No refunds. Pets are allowed on the walk. Leash laws must be observed. There is a restroom at the house and a few along the trail. Wheelchairs and strollers will be fine on most of the trail.

Refreshments: Water and candy will be available at the start/finish table.
