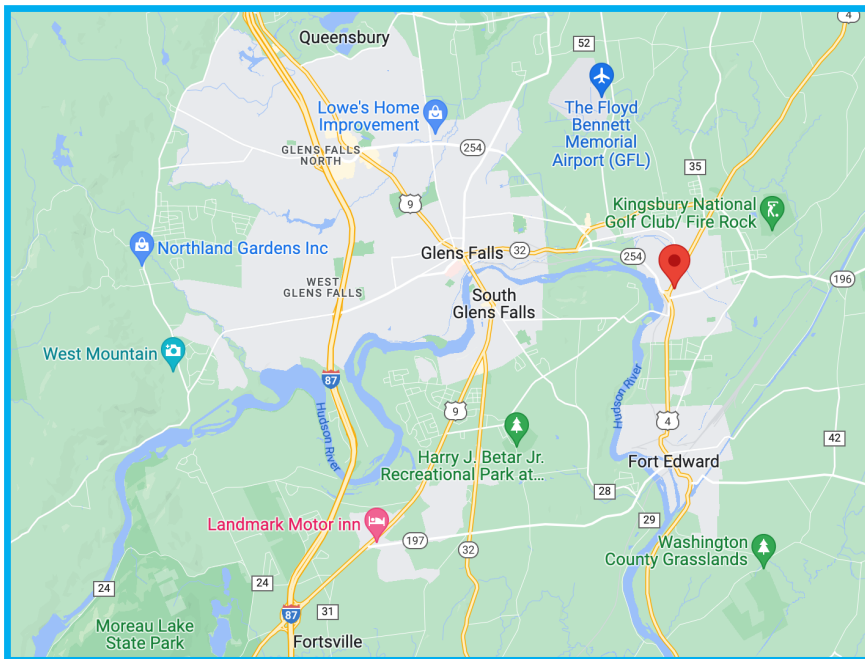


Directions: 220 Main St Hudson Falls NY 12839 * *Please note: Park in the parking lot behind the village hall and enter the building from the rear door.*

From Albany, South & East: Take I-87 (Northway) to Exit 17N for US-9 N towards South Glens Falls. Take US-9 N for approx. 1.4 mi. Right on NY-197 E for approx. 4.7 mi. Left on US-4 N/Broadway for approx. 2.6 mi. Broadway turns into Main St. Right on Locust St. Village Hall parking lot will be on your left.

From Saratoga & West: Take NY-29 TRUCK E/Broadway/NY-50 N to I-87, Exit 15. Take I-87 N towards Montreal for approx. 9.8 miles to Exit 17N. Follow directions from south and east.

From the North: Take I-87 south to Exit 17N. Follow directions from south and east

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AVA Rules & Conditions

Start/Finish: Hudson Falls Village Hall, Hudson Falls, NY

Time: Registration will be between 10-11:30 am, Finish by 1:30 pm.

Trail Rated: 1A - The 5k route is on the streets of Hudson Falls and a short distance on the tow path.

Stipulation: There is no walk preregistration and this walk will take place regardless of weather. At time of registration, each participant accepts the guidelines for AVA Volkssport events. There are no refunds if the walk is terminated for any reason. Books will be stamped accordingly. Pets are not allowed into the Start Point but may be leashed on the walk route. Children under 11 must be accompanied by an adult and watched carefully.

Procedure: Each participant must register and sign a waiver at the "Start" table. A "Start Card" must also be filled out but there will be no checkpoints along the route! This card is then returned to the "Finish" table so that we know you have completed your walk, and it now becomes the property of ESCV.

Event Fees: All participants will now pay \$3.

IVV Books: Event & Distance books will be available at the Start/Finish for \$6.00 each. Event and Distance Credit may be earned each time the course is completed. Participants that become new members by joining ESCV today receive New Walker Kits containing both Event & Distance books and three free event coupons! Membership for the remainder of the year is half price, \$6 per individual or \$10 per family.

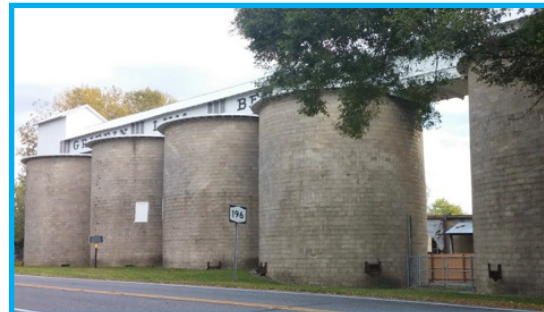

Hudson Falls is a village of 8,000 people located on the east side of the Hudson River a short distance away from Glens Falls. Originally a small sleepy village known as Sandy Hill, Hudson Falls grew in size and importance in the 1830's with the opening of the Glens Falls Feeder Canal.

The sleepy village became a prosperous mill center producing lumber and other products. The Glens Falls Feeder Canal closed to commercial traffic in the 1930's and the entire length is now a 14 mile long walking and bike trail along the old tow path. The walking route will be on parts of this tow path. The



route will also be on village streets passing the historic coal silos built in 1906 using cement blocks invented by Griffin Lumber. Each silo held a different grade of coal. An interesting example of adaptive reuse is the fact that the silos can now be used as a public meeting space.



Another must see in Hudson Falls are the Five Combines otherwise known as the five site stair locks of the Feeder Canal. This feeder canal was needed in order to supply water from the Hudson River to the highest point on the

Champlain Canal near Fort Edward. The north country goods going all the way to New York City included lumber, lime, marble, paper, clay, apples, and potatoes

The route finishes in the small historic district of the village green bordered by late Victorian commercial buildings including the newly restored Strand Theater.

The route will pass by an amazing patch of blooming squills on the lawn of a lovely Victorian home on Pearl St. The date of the walk was specifically chosen to coincide with this event.
