**Startpoint: Gazebo Park at 122 N. Weenonah Avenue
Claremore, Oklahoma 74017**

Driving Directions: From Tulsa: Take I-44 East toward Joplin (tolls apply); take Exit 255 toward OK-20/Claremore/Pryor. Use the right lane to turn left onto OK-20 W/E Will Rogers Blvd; Turn right onto E Will Rogers Blvd Turn right onto N Weenonah Ave. There is parking just to the West of the park, and along the North side next to the museum. Watch for TWC signs.

Located along America's Mother Road and home to Oklahoma's favorite son, Claremore has a rich history and plenty to explore. Claremore is famous for being the home of Will Rogers. Claremore's Will Rogers Memorial Museum displays photographs and Rogers's original manuscripts, private letters, and personal papers. Another point of interest is the J. M. Davis Arms & Historical Museum.

Restrooms and water available at the start table. Trail rating: 1A; medium difficulty for wheelchairs and strollers. Pets are allowed, but must be on a leash.

**Startpoint: Jack Gordon Park at 421 Karen Miller
Parkway (aka Locust Street, Nowata, Oklahoma
74426**

Driving Directions: From Claremore –Return to Will Rogers Blvd, and turn Right (West) Continue onto OK-88 N; then turn Right onto US-169 N. Once in Nowata, and just past the Dollar General, Turn Left onto E Seneca Ave and then turn Left at the 1st cross street onto S Locust St. Watch for TWC signs.

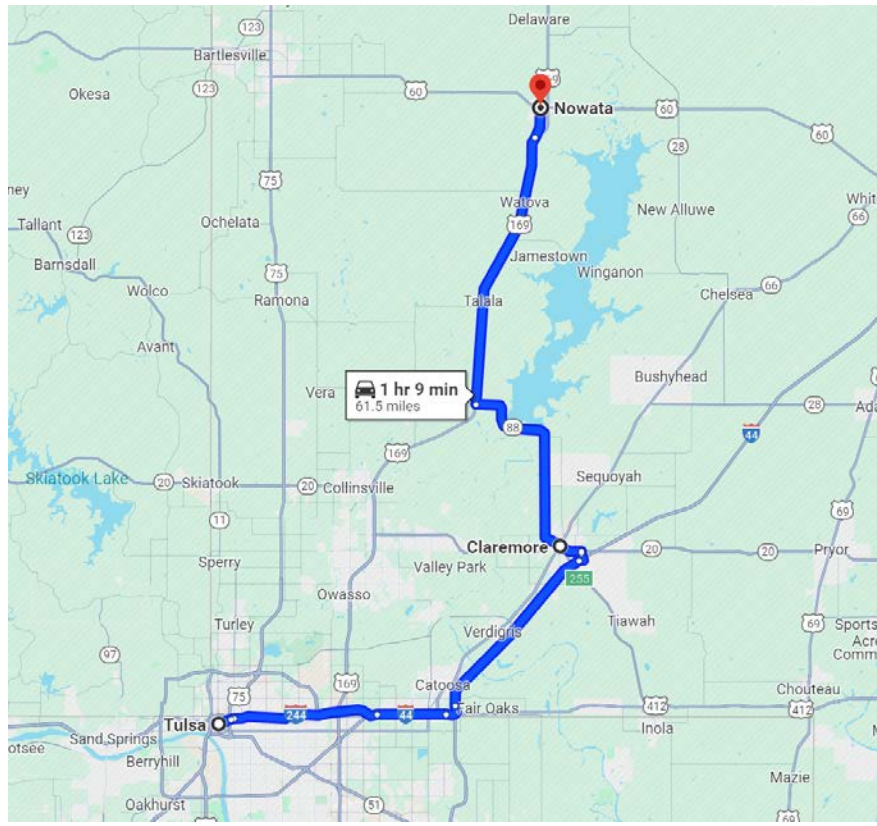
In the Boom Days of Oklahoma, the City of Nowata would become known worldwide for having the world's shallowest oil deposits. This reputation would start a wild race to pump the formations throughout the community.

Oil was originally discovered in the area in the early 1900's and became the backbone of the economy. A majority of local infrastructure can trace its very existence to the oil industry.

In what is known as present day Nowata, Oklahoma, there have been many different American Indian nations who have called this area home. For it was the Chief of the Delaware Tribe who blessed these lands with its namesake, "no-we-ata." Delaware for "welcome."

Water and restrooms will be available at the start table; trail rating 1A; medium to hard difficulty for wheelchairs and strollers. Pets are allowed, but must be on a leash.

Claremore to Nowata: 32 miles, approximately 45 minutes; (via OK 88 N and US 169 N)
