












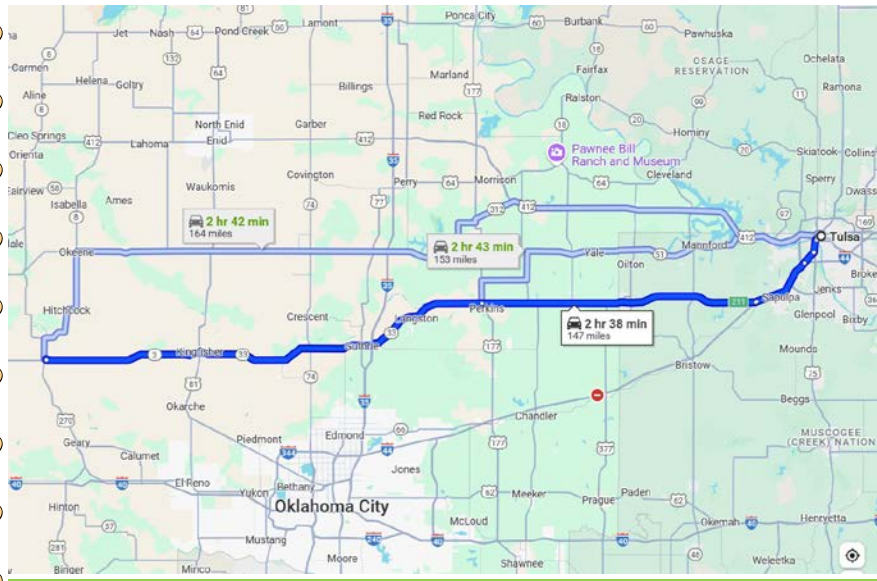


  
 **2-COUNTY FALL FROLIC** **10/18/2025: 5K/10K WALK** (Event ID SC/129469) IVV Credit only **Watonga, Oklahoma** (Blaine County) Saturday, October 18 – 9:00 to 11:00 am; finish by 1:00 pm **Startpoint: Shelter at Wheeler/Library Park at 200 W. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, Watonga, Oklahoma** **Driving Directions: From Tulsa:** Take Highway 33/3 West to Watonga. (approx. 150 miles total) In Watonga, turn Right onto Burford Avenue and proceed to 2<sup>nd</sup> Street to Wheeler Park, the Startpoint. **From OKC:** Take I-40 West to Exit 108 and proceed North on Highway 281 and then continue northerly on Highway 270 to Watonga. (approx. 70 miles total) Turn Right on 2<sup>nd</sup> Street and proceed to Wheeler Park, the Startpoint. Watch for TWC signs. Watonga is located on former Cheyenne and Arapaho Indian Reservation lands that were allotted to individual tribal members, and the excess opened to white settlers in the Land Run of 1892. Watonga is named after Arapaho Chief Watonga, whose name means "Black Coyote". The town began as a tent city on April 19, 1892. A post office opened in Watonga during the same year. However, the first railroad line through Watonga was not built until 1901–02, when the Enid and Anadarko Railway (later the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railway) constructed a 60 miles rail line from Guthrie. Watonga is the hometown for Clarence Nash, (1904 -1985) the original voice of Donald Duck. Both walks qualify for several Special Programs. See listing at each start table. More information as well as any updates will be found for each event on the AVA website, under Events. **10/18/2025: 6K/10K WALK** (Event ID SC/129470) IVV Credit only **Kingfisher, Oklahoma** (Kingfisher County) Saturday, October 18 – Noon to 2:00 pm; finish by 3:30pm. **Startpoint: Shaw Park at 11<sup>th</sup> and Oklahoma, Kingfisher, Oklahoma** **Driving Directions: From Watonga** –Return to Highway 33/3, and proceed East to Kingfisher. Turn Right (South) onto Highway 81 (Main Street) and proceed to Oklahoma Street. Turn Right (West) and continue to Shaw Park, the Startpoint. Watch for TWC signs. Kingfisher came into existence on April 22, 1889, when land owned by the federal government was opened to settlement by "land run". A huge area in what is now central Oklahoma was literally "peopled" by non-Native Americans overnight. The city is situated on a part of the Chisholm Trail, over which millions of Texas longhorns were driven to railheads in Kansas in the years immediately following the Civil War. Extension of the railroads and settlement of the open range ended this colorful era. Kingfisher is the hometown of Sam Walton, (1918 – 1992) founder of Walmart and Sam's Club. **General Walk information:** Water will be available at the start table; restroom not available at Watonga startpoint – see Doc's Grocery on Main Street. Trail rating 1A; medium to hard difficulty for wheelchairs and strollers.
