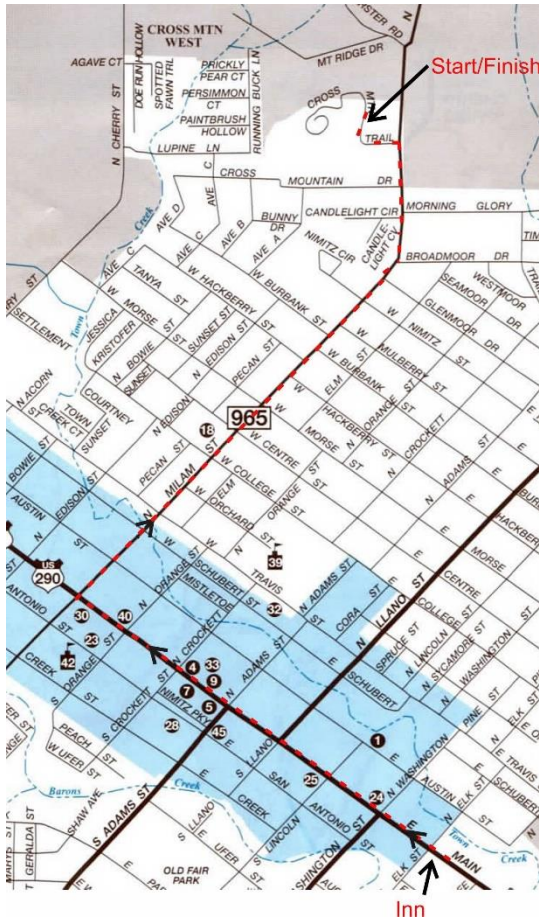


DIRECTIONS TO START

If you're driving directly to Cross Mountain Park on Tuesday, there is no physical address (nearest intersection is N. Milam and Cross Mountain Drive).

From the Sunday House Inn at 501 E. Main (and Elk), drive seven blocks west on Main (290). This will be N. Milam – take a right turn. Drive approximately 10 blocks (different blocks on either side). Shortly after you pass Cross Mountain Drive on your left, you will see a small road on the left with a sign “Cross Mountain Park.” Turn there and proceed to the parking lot.

The social room (and registration for the 2nd and 3rd walks) is in the meeting room at the Sunday House Inn. It's Room 118, in the southeast corner, and will be available around 11:00 a.m. on Tuesday to whenever.

ELIGIBILITY/TYPE OF EVENT: Noncompetitive. Walk or run at your own pace. The event is open to all, and families are encouraged to participate. Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult. All participants (or their parents if under 12) will sign a waiver of responsibility and must carry a Start Card on the route. These will be conducted as Featured Year Round Events. The events will be held regardless of weather conditions. There is a \$4 fee per walker (12+) to help cover insurance, advertising, etc.

31 December (Tuesday) – Cross Mountain Park YRE. **START POINT:** see map on the back. **REGISTRATION:** 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. Walkers should be finished by 4 p.m. **DISTANCE:** 5-10 km. Climbing the hill is optional. **WALK ROUTE:** 1A, except for the hill, which has a graveled path. Restrooms and picnic tables are available at the start.

31 December (Tuesday) – Pilgrimage YRE. **START POINT:** Sunday House Inn (501 E. Main). **REGISTRATION:** 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. Walkers should be finished by midnight. **BRING A FLASHLIGHT FOR SAFETY AND TO READ STREETSIGNS.** **DISTANCE:** 5-10 km. **WALK ROUTE:** 1A, sidewalks. Restrooms are available at the start, the Marktplatz, and along the route. Logbooks will be stamped at the Start to allow walkers to get distracted by the decorations.

1 January (Wednesday) – St. Mary's Cemeteries YRE. **START POINT:** Sunday House Inn (501 E. Main). **REGISTRATION:** 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. Walkers should be finished by 2 p.m. **DISTANCE:** 7-12 km. **WALK ROUTE:** 1A, sidewalks. Restrooms are available at the start, the Marktplatz, and along the route. Logbooks will again be stamped at the Start.

PETS: Leashed pets are allowed along the routes; however, not in buildings along the routes. You must clean up after your pets.
