WELCOME TO SOUTH BEND/NOTRE DAME INDIANA

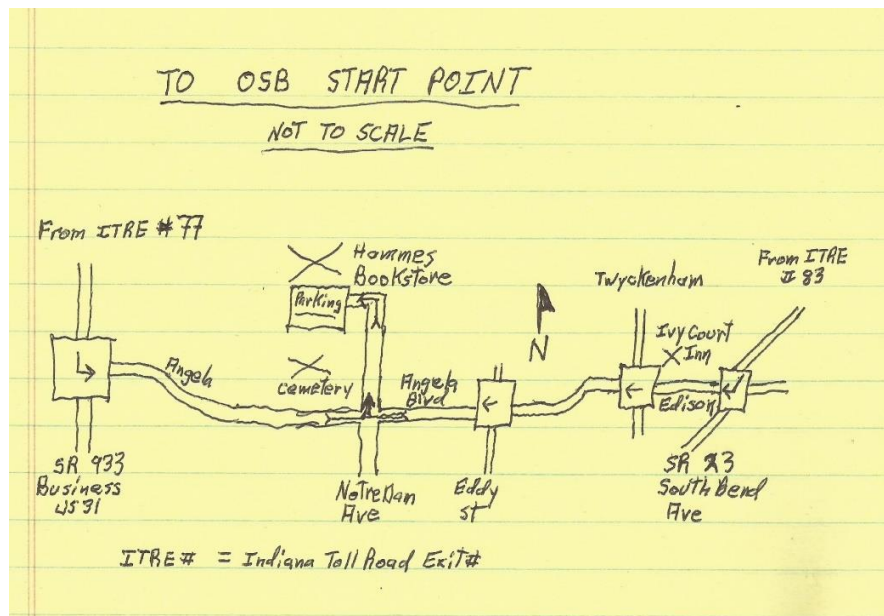
This Year-Round walking event is hosted by the Hoosier Hikers. The event is temporarily being moved to the Online Start Box, as the start box location is no longer accessible for the remainder of 2020 to combat the spread of Covid-19. Two distances are offered (7, & 12 kilometers), which allow all walkers the opportunity to experience the historic, artistic and cultural thrills of a major American University.

This event and its two routes are sanctioned by the IVV through the AVA and qualify for credit toward IVV achievement awards.

The two routes offer the opportunity to receive credit for the following special programs, as indicated:

Walking the USA A-Z (ALL routes)

To begin your adventure, you will need to travel to the Start/Finish Point. The Start/Finish Point for this event is the public parking area at the front (to the South) of the Hammes Bookstore, 100 Eck Center, Notre Dame, Indiana 46556). If travelling Eastbound on Angela Boulevard from SR 933/Business US 31, at the intersection of Notre Dame Avenue and Edison/Angela TURN LEFT onto Notre Dame. After the first stop sign proceed to the next drive on your left, which will take you to the parking area, which serves as the Start/Finish Point. If travelling Southbound on SR 23, at the intersection of SR 23 and Edison/Angela TURN RIGHT onto Edison/Angela. At intersection of Angela and Notre Dame Avenue, where you will TURN RIGHT onto Notre Dame Avenue. After the first stop sign proceed to the next drive on your left, which will take you to the parking area, which serves as the Start/Finish Point. Just past the cemetery on your left you will see a parking area to the front (South façade) of the Hammes Bookstore, which is where you should park your vehicle in the visitor spaces and start your sojourn.

WATER AND RESTROOMS MAY CURRENTLY NOT ALWAYS BE AVAILABLE at the Start/Finish Point or along the routes due to closures of public facilities in response to Covid-19. So, plan accordingly.

ON ALL ROUTES SAFETY IS PARAMOUNT. All routes are on sidewalks or improved trails. However, if it should be necessary to walk on a street for some reason, please do so facing approaching traffic. All routes are intersected by streets, which should be crossed cautiously using the available pedestrian crossings.

In view of the social distancing guidance issued by the CDC and state & local health authorities, please avoid any and all crowds along the routes, carry and make use of hand sanitizer, wear a mask (if appropriate) and keep at least six feet between yourself and other people. The University of Notre Dame requires the donning of masks to enter any facility on campus. Some facilities may be closed to the general public and will have notices posted at their entrances.

If there is an existential injury producing accident on any of the routes, call 911 immediately. Once the existential threat has passed, contact the President of the Hoosier Hikers, Bob Buzolich, at 574-339-9140, or via email at sonofbuzz@prodigy.net and complete an AVA incident form.

Whenever the Physical Start Box may become available, please use either the Online Start Box (OSB) or Physical Start Box (PSB) to register and complete the event. Do NOT mix and match, for example, by registering using the OSB then completing your event using the PSB nor signing the PSB log sheet. The sponsoring club only receives credit for an OSB participation when an OSB registration has been completed online by entering your participation date, distances, and any special programs using the OSB.

Upon completing this event, when using the OSB, please be sure log back into the OSB system to "finish/complete" your online registration and record your distance. When you return to the OSB system to finish/complete the event, please note that you will NOT need to enter checkpoint answers.

MAP & DIRECTIONS FOR 7-K ROUTE AT SOUTH BEND/NOTRE DAME YRE

Welcome to the South Bend and Notre Dame, Indiana, for the Hoosier Hikers 28th annual Year-Round Event, AVA Sanction Number MA20/Y0291. This map and directions are for the Event's 7- kilometer route.

The 7- kilometer route commences from the visitor's parking area at the front of the Hammes Bookstore (Eck Center) on the Notre Dame Campus.

CAUTION: Regardless of the time year, Notre Dame is an active place with new construction posing possible hazards along the route. Please be alert to such situations, and adjust the route for your walk accordingly.

TO HIT THE TRAIL, from your vehicle proceed in an Easterly direction back to Notre Dame Avenue.

1) Upon reaching Notre Dame Avenue TURN LEFT and proceed in a Northerly direction along Notre Dame Avenue toward the Golden Dome (building number 1008 on the map) Along this leg of the route you will pass the Morris Inn, which has public facilities (water and restrooms) available, when open.

2) At the front of the Golden Dome, turn around and face the statue of Jesus (you are now facing South). Go toward the statue. Midway between the Dome and the statue TURN RIGHT (you are now facing West), and proceed in a Westerly direction along the sidewalks and Corby Drive to the intersection of Corby Drive and Holy Cross Drive. Along this leg of the route you will pass the Basilica of the Sacred Heart. The Basilica serves as CHECKPOINT #1: What year is inscribed on the cornerstone to the right of the main entrance to the Basilica? Answer: _____

3) From the intersection of Holy Cross Drive and Corby Drive you will see a lake to your left. This is Saint Mary's Lake. Also

to your right is the Grotto. Feel free to visit the Grotto before starting around the lake in a counter-clockwise direction, keeping the lake on your left, using the gravel/asphalt trail that follows the lakeshore.

4) Upon returning to the intersection Holy Cross Drive and Corby Drive, continue straight on Holy Cross Drive in a Northeasterly direction to the entry of Lot A9, which is at the rear of Lewis Hall (building 1078 on the map). Both Lot A9 and the building are to your right. To your left, you will see a small dirt and cinder path on the South shore of Saint Joseph's Lake. Proceed along this path in a clockwise direction, keeping the lake on your right. About 155 yards (133 of my steps with a 3.5 foot stride) beyond the end of the beach/boat house (restrooms open during the summer) you will see a SECOND set of concrete steps to your left. Go up the steps.

5) At the top of the steps you will return to Holy Cross Drive. Cross Holy Cross Drive to the sidewalk, and TURN LEFT and walk along Holy Cross Drive using the sidewalk to its intersection with Saint Joseph's Drive. The intersection is a four-way stop with the Fire Station on the Southwest corner. TURN RIGHT and follow Saint Joseph's Drive to its intersection with Cavanaugh Drive. On you left you will see The Library. To your right, you will see a mall-like area that leads back to the main campus. Proceed West until you reach the CLARK MEMORIAL FOUNTAIN (structure #3005 on the map). The Fountain serves as CHECKPOINT #2: How many stone pillars surround the globe in the center of the fountain? Answer: _____

6) Return to the fountain and look toward The Library (building #1012 on the map), and you will be facing the Western façade of The Library. Along any of the sidewalks proceed to the Western façade of the Library. Water and restrooms available, when The Library is open. Proceed to The Library's Southern façade, which has a mural of Jesus. Proceed in a Southerly direction toward The Stadium using any of the sidewalks.

7) Upon reaching Moose Krause Circle TURN RIGHT, being extremely careful due to all of the construction around The

Stadium. You will notice The Snite Museum on your right, which is open to the public and offers a unique diversion to the Volksmarch route, if so inclined. Water and restrooms are available in The Museum, when open. Proceed on a diagonal in a SW direction from the SW corner of the museum to the sidewalk to the right of DeBartolo Hall. TURN LEFT, and

proceed to the end of the Mendoza College of Business. At this next sidewalk, TURN RIGHT and return to the Hammes Bookstore parking area.

MAP & DIRECTIONS FOR 12-K ROUTE AT SOUTH BEND/NOTRE DAME YRE

WELCOME to South Bend and Notre Dame, Indiana for the Hoosier Hiker's 28th annual 12Km Year-Round Event, AVA Sanction number MA2020/Y291.

The 12 - kilometer route commences from the visitor's parking area at the front of the Hammes Bookstore (Eck Center) on the Notre Dame Campus.

CAUTION: Regardless of the time of year, Notre Dame is an active place with new construction posing possible hazards along the route. Please be alert to such situations and adjust the route for your walk accordingly.

TO HIT THE TRAIL: Walk back to Notre Dame Avenue. TURN LEFT and proceed in a Northerly direction along Notre Dame Avenue to the Golden Dome (Building Number 1008 on the map). Along this leg of the route you will pass the entry point to Holy Cross Drive and the Morris Inn. At the Morris Inn public facilities (water and restrooms) are available when the Inn is open and available to the public.

1) At the front of the Golden Dome, TURN AROUND and face the statue of Jesus (you are now facing South). Go toward the statue. Midway between the Dome and the statue TURN RIGHT (you are now facing West) and proceed in a Westerly direction along the sidewalks and Corby Drive to the intersection of Corby Drive and Holy Cross Drive. Along this leg of the route you will pass the Basilica of the Sacred Heart. The Basilica serves as CHECKPOINT #1: What year is inscribed on the cornerstone to the right of the main entrance to the Basilica? Answer: _____

2) From the intersection of Holy Cross Drive and Corby Drive you will see a lake to your left. This is Saint Mary's Lake. To your right is the Grotto. Feel free to visit the Grotto before starting around the lake in a counterclockwise direction, keeping the lake on your left and using the gravel/asphalt trail that follows the lake shore.

3) Upon returning to the intersection of Holy Cross and Corby continue straight on Holy Cross in a Northeasterly direction to the entry of Lot A9, which is at the rear of Lewis Hall (Building 1078 on the map). Both Lot A9 and the building are to your right. To your left, you will see a small dirt and cinder path on the South shore of St Joseph's Lake.

Proceed on this path in a clockwise direction, keeping the lake to your right. About 155 yards (133 of my steps with a 3-1/2 foot stride) beyond the end of the beach/boat house (restrooms open in the summer), you will see a SECOND set of concrete steps to your left. Go up the steps.

4) At the top of the steps you will return to Holy Cross Drive. Proceed across Holy Cross Drive to the sidewalk, and TURN LEFT to walk along the Holy Cross Drive to its intersection with Saint Joseph's Drive. The intersection is a four-way stop with the Fire Station on the Southwest corner. TURN RIGHT and follow Saint Joseph's Drive to its intersection with Cavanaugh Drive. On your left you see The Library. To your right, which is West, you will see a mall-like area that leads back to the main campus. Proceed West until you reach the CLARK MEMORIAL FOUNTAIN (structure 3005 on the map). The fountain is CHECKPOINT #2: How many stone pillars surround the globe in the center of the fountain? Answer: _____

5) Return to the fountain. First look to your right (South), and you will see the Nieuwland Science Hall (structure 1050), which is named for Father Nieuwland, who taught chemistry at Notre Dame and is credited with being the father of synthetic rubber. Then look East toward The Library (structure number 1076 on the map). You will be facing the Western façade of The Library. Along any of the sidewalks, proceed to Western façade. Water and restrooms are available when The Library is open and available to the public. Proceed to the Southern façade, which has a mural of Jesus. Continue in a Southerly direction toward The Stadium using any of the sidewalks.

6) Upon reaching Mouse Krause Circle, TURN RIGHT (being extremely careful due to all of the construction around The Stadium. You will notice the Snite Museum on your Right, which is open to the public and offers a unique diversion to the Volksmarch route, if so inclined. Water and restrooms are available in the museum, when open. Proceed on a diagonal in a SW direction from the SW corner of the museum to the sidewalk to the right of DeBartolo Hall. TURN LEFT and proceed to the end of the Mendoza College of Business. TURN LEFT towards The Legends Restaurant. Water and restrooms are available in The Legends, when open and available to the public. Now TURN AROUND AND RETURN THE SAME WAY. When you get back to the end of DeBartolo Hall, you will see a sculpture to your left, "Christ the Teacher." This is CHECKPOINT #3: What is the date of the dedication? Answer: _____

7) Bear to the right, once again passing The Snite. Continue on until you come to the sidewalk to the left of the Jordan Science Learning Center (structure 1193). TURN LEFT and proceed until you see

Pasquerilla Road on your right. TURN RIGHT and follow to Leahy Drive. TURN LEFT and proceed along Leahy Drive to its intersection with Bulla Road. TURN RIGHT onto Bulla Road and proceed along Bulla to its intersection with Twyckenham Drive. TURN RIGHT onto Twyckenham and follow it to the intersection of Twyckenham and Edison/Angela, which is across from the Ivy Court Inn & Suites.

8) Proceed in a Westerly direction along Angela to its intersection with Joyce Drive, where you will see signage to the Hayes Family Sculpture Park. Proceed to and enter the sculpture park. Proceed through the park using the improved trail, and following the forks indicated on the park map, as you proceed through the park. Where the trail terminates, you will be on Eddy Street. To your left, you will see a stop light. Proceed to the stop light, which is the intersection of Eddy Street and Angela Boulevard, and turn right to proceed along Angela

to its intersection with Notre Dame Avenue, which is the main entrance to the Notre Dame campus.

9) Cross Notre Dame Avenue and TURN RIGHT (you are now facing North) to proceed in a Northerly direction along Notre Dame Avenue. Immediately upon clearing the main gate, you will see a cemetery entrance to your left. This is the historic Cedar Grove Cemetery. TURN LEFT and proceed into the cemetery along the paved street. When you see the family name of Eichstaedt, you will also see an intersecting street to the right. TURN RIGHT and proceed along the intersection street until it forms a T-intersection. TURN RIGHT and exit the cemetery onto Notre Dame Avenue.

10) Turn LEFT onto Notre Dame Avenue and return to the Start/Finish Point
