NOTE: Orange County and Winter Park have specific rules to minimize any spread of COVID-19 virus. These include: wearing a face mask in any public areas; social distancing required.

DIRECTIONS: GPS: 28.5977164,-81.3518508 . To 148 E Morse Ave., Winter Park, from Orlando take I-4E to Exit 87, Fairbanks Ave. Turn right (left from I-4/W) for 1.8 miles into Winter Park. Turn left on New York Ave. Turn right on Morse Ave. and right into parking. From east on SR417S use exit 38, Aloma Ave., and turn right (left from SR417N) for 6.2 mi. From SR436N/S turn left on Aloma Ave. (right from SR436S) for 3.1 mi. Both turn right on New York. Turn right on Morse Ave. and right into parking. Strollers and wheelchairs permitted. Pets allowed. Please carry water -no matter if you think you do not need any.

Winter Park is a well shaded walking community among lakes, Rollins College (5K), lovely homes and landscaping, parks and many eating and buying opportunities on Park Ave.

The walks start in front of the AMTRAK Station. The 10K instructions are prepared from the current pre-COVID start location and you start the walk at instruction #28. The 5K starts at the station with instruction #1.

This map and directions may only be used in conjunction with a signed American Volkssport Association athletic waiver. All other uses are prohibited.

Points of Interest (POI)

Keyed to instruction number

- 1. Train station** depot was built in 1890 by the South Florida Railroad ten years after it built a line from Sanford to Orlando. A newer passenger station was built in 1913 by the Atlantic Coast Line Railroad (ACL) and included a freight depot, which is located to the south of the current station and the Saturday's Farmer's Market location.
- 7. Rollins College** is a private, coeducational liberal arts college, founded in 1885 and located in Winter Park along the shores of Lake Virginia. Rollins has about 30 undergraduate majors and several graduate programs. In 2017 it was ranked #2 Regional Universities, South, by *U.S. News & World Report*. Rollins College has ranked among the most beautiful U.S. college campuses by The Princeton Review for the past decade, ranking #1 in 2015 and #10 most recently in 2017.
- 8. Annie Russell Theater:** The longest continuously operating theater in Florida and named to the National Register of Historic Places. After a distinguished career on the New York and London stages, Annie Russell officially retired from the stage in 1918 and moved to Winter Park. She was encouraged by a friend to teach at Rollins College, and in 1931, the Annie Russell Theatre was founded at the college. She opened the theatre in 1932 with a performance of *In a Balcony*.
- Knowles Chapel:** Construction of the chapel was begun in March 1931 and it was dedicated on March 19, 1932. At that time it was located in the center of the campus. The architect of the chapel was the famous ecclesiastical architect, Ralph Adams Cram. The Dean of Religious Life acts as the pastor of the College.
- 10.** The Rollins Walk of Fame, which circles Mills lawn, consists of stones taken from places connected to historic people. Past college president Hamilton Holt came up with the idea in the 1920s, and based the Walk of Fame on the "ancestral walk" at his home in Connecticut. As of 2003, the Walk of Fame had about 530 stones, the vast majority (455) honoring men. Most stones are associated with specific people, but a few—like the stones from Australia and the Berlin Wall—honor places or events.
- 12. Cornell Fine Arts Museum:** It opened in 1978 thanks to George and Harriet W. Cornell donation to construct a complex to include a new museum, renovating The Morse Gallery of Art. X
- 21. Winter Park Golf Club** opened in 1918 and has hosted well known golfers like Robert Jones and Sam Snead.
- 23. Casa Feliz** is on the historic Register and was bought by the city & moved from a lake lot to its current location.
- 25. The Charles Hosmer Morse Museum Of American Art** houses the world's most comprehensive collection of Louis Comfort Tiffany) including Tiffany jewelry, pottery, paintings, art glass, leaded-glass windows, lamps, and the chapel interior he designed for the 1893 World's Columbian Exposition in Chicago. It was founded by Jeannette McKean in 1942 and named for her grandfather, Chicago industrialist and Winter Park philanthropist Charles Hosmer Morse. Museum hours: 9:30 – 4:00pm T- S (Open until 8:00 p.m. Fri, Nov - April); Su 1– 4 p.m. Closed Mon.
- St. Margaret Mary Church** across the street from Morse. In 1924, the Diocese purchased a site for a church at the corner of Knowles and Canton. The cornerstone was laid on October 17th, the feast of Saint Margaret Mary. The first Mass was celebrated in the new church on December 28th, 1924. The church was dedicated on January 30, 1927 by Bishop Patrick Barry. It remained under the care of pastors from St. James Church (Orlando) until 1947 when Reverend Daniel Hegarty was named the first pastor of St. Margaret Mary Parish.

1.	Facing tracks, LEFT to Morse Blvd. from the parking lot of railroad station. POI.
2.	LEFT on Morse. Cross New York & Virginia. <i>Nice Farmers Mkt on Saturday on right.</i>
3.	LEFT on Pennsylvania Ave.
4.	Cross & LEFT on New England Ave. crossing Virginia & New York Aves.
5.	Cross & RIGHT on Park Ave.
6.	LEFT on Comstock Ave. Continue on red brick walkway crossing Interlachen to crosswalk
7.	RIGHT on crosswalk crossing Fairbanks onto Rollins College. POI
8.	Pass Bush Science Center on the right, Annie Russell Theater, Rose Garden, and Knowles Chapel on the left. POI
9.	Cross Holt Ave. to flagpole. RIGHT on sidewalk;
10.	LEFT on 2d sidewalk onto Walk of Fame. Look for large stone wheel on the right. POI
11.	Curve LEFT & pass the large Mills building returning to Holt.
12.	RIGHT on Holt walking downhill towards Cornell Art Museum. POI
13.	Cross to Museum & LEFT; LEFT on right sidewalk returning uphill.
14.	RIGHT at 1 st walkway past Rex Beach Hall at yield sign. (about ½ block). Pass Alford Sports Center

15.	RIGHT at Tennis Stadium.
16.	LEFT at T between courts. Large Rollins banner.
17.	LEFT at Y then RIGHT to garage.
18.	RIGHT then LEFT at Campus Safety to crosswalk.
19.	Cross & LEFT with Dinky Park on the right. Restrooms available.
20.	LEFT on Ollie (no sign) w/garage on left.
21.	Cross Fairbanks onto Chase Ave.
22.	LEFT on E. New England Ave.
23.	RIGHT at crosswalk & LEFT on New England
24.	RIGHT on Alexander Ct. to Lake & return to New England.
25.	RIGHT on E. New England Ave.
26.	RIGHT on Interlachen Ave.
27.	LEFT crossing Interlachen at crosswalk at tiny Morse Park just before golf clubhouse. POI
28.	Straight on sidewalk thru park to Y & RIGHT thru arch, following sidewalk/bricks.
29.	LEFT thru Casa Feliz passageway on brick walkway with golf course on the right. POI
30.	Cross & LEFT on Park Avenue.
31.	Pass Morse Museum on right; St Margaret Mary Church on left. POI.
32.	Cross Canton, pass shops, & cross Garfield.
33.	RIGHT on 1st sidewalk into Central Park walking behind stage. <i>Pets are not allowed in the park—see NOTE.</i>
N O T E	<i>If you have a pet on the leash, continue straight to Morse Blvd. Cross & RIGHT on Morse to finish at the Station.</i>
34.	Follow sidewalk past stage and bear RIGHT at the harp fountain.
35.	RIGHT on Morse Blvd., cross tracks, and LEFT to finish at the railroad station.

<u>OSB Start at #28.</u>	
1.	Continue onto Arbor Park Dr.
2.	LEFT onto Oneco Ave. Little Free Library #59094 at 1360.
3.	RIGHT onto Temple Dr.; CROSS Oneco Ave.
4.	Carefully CROSSING Temple, turn LEFT onto Whitesell Dr. Walk on the left if no sidewalk.
5.	CROSS & LEFT onto Via Tuscany.
6.	RIGHT onto Via Lombardy.
7.	LEFT onto Via Amalfi.
8.	LEFT onto Via Lugano.
9.	Bear RIGHT to stay on Via Lugano; stay left!
10.	CROSS Via Lugano, turn RIGHT on Via Tuscany. <i>Look for the dog sculpture, among others, in the yard on the corner of Via Tuscany and Alabama Dr.</i>
11.	CROSS & RIGHT onto Alabama Dr. Follow Alabama Dr. keeping Lake Maitland and Kraft Azalea Garden on your right.
12.	CROSS Harding St.
13.	RIGHT and CROSS Alabama at the crosswalk into Kraft Azalea Park, through the pillars flanking the walkway.
POI	<i>Kraft Azalea Garden. This 5.22-acre public garden is located on the shore of Lake Maitland and is open all year from 8 a.m. until dusk. Lakefront, secluded and unique, Kraft Azalea is Winter Park's secret garden! This beautiful park is shaded by enormous cypress trees that add to the old Florida charm of the property.</i>
14.	LEFT onto the gravel path. <i>Admire the old, tall cypress trees along the path.</i>
15.	Bear LEFT on the path toward the park exit.
16.	CROSS Alabama Dr., carefully, to the sidewalk.
17.	RIGHT on Alabama Dr.
18.	CROSS & RIGHT onto Palmer Ave.

19.	LEFT on Lincoln Circle.
20.	LEFT onto Golfview Terrace and stay to the right.
21.	RIGHT onto E Webster Ave.
POI	<i>Winter Park Golf Course. On the left, the historic Winter Park Golf Course, built in 1914, underwent some much-needed repairs in 2016. The Golf Channel, and Golf Advisor, named it the 5th Best Short Course in the entire country. The course has hosted well-known golfers such as Robert Jones and Sam Snead.</i>
22.	CROSS N Park Ave. and turn LEFT onto N Park Ave. (crossing Webster), passing the golf course.
23.	CROSS Cole Ave. and then pass the Charles Hosmer Morse Museum of American Art on your right.
POI	<i>The Morse Museum. Founded by Jeanette Genius McKean (1909-89) in 1942 and named for her grandfather, Chicago industrialist and Winter Park philanthropist Charles Hosmer Morse, its collections were built over a half-century by Mrs. McKean and her husband, Hugh F. McKean (1908-95) the Museum's director until his death. Museum hours: 9:30 – 4:00pm Tue-Sat (open until 8:00pm, Fri., Nov-Apr); Sun. 1:00 – 4:00pm. Closed Mon.</i>
24.	After crossing Garfield Ave. at end of shops turn RIGHT onto the path into Central Park (no pets).
NOTE	<i>If you have a pet on the leash, continue straight to Morse Blvd. Cross & RIGHT on Morse to finish at the Station.</i>
25.	Follow the path, keeping the train tracks to your right, around the fountain to Morse Blvd.
26.	RIGHT , carefully crossing the train tracks.
27.	LEFT at the crosswalk and CROSS Morse Blvd. near the train tracks. You are finished.

28.	Go to the red brick walkway to the Winter Park AMTRAK Station front (restrooms available).
POI	<i>AMTRAK Train Station. The AMTRAK train station depot was originally built in 1890 by the South Florida Railroad, ten years after the railroad built a line from Sanford to Orlando. A newer station was built in 1913 by the Atlantic Coast Line Railroad (ACL) and included a freight depot, which is located to the south of the current station.</i>

29.	RIGHT from the front of AMTRAK Station.
N O T E	<i>If you have a pet on the leash, continue straight to New England, Go to #32.</i>
30.	LEFT at the first RR track crossing, carefully crossing the train tracks to the first sidewalk in Central Park (no pets in the park).
31.	RIGHT at the first path, toward the Central Park Rose Garden. Circle RIGHT ½ turn through the Garden and exit at New England Ave. (no sign)
32.	LEFT onto E New England Ave.
33.	CROSS and LEFT on S Interlachen Ave.
POI	<i>All Saints Episcopal Church. One block S of New England Ave, on Interlachen Ave. is All Saints Episcopal Church. The Church fronts Interlachen Ave., was built in 1941-1942, and is an example of Late Gothic Revival architecture. The church has a cruciform footprint and was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 2000.</i>
POI	<i>Woman's Club of Winter Park. The Woman's Club, an example of the Neoclassical Revival architectural style, is located on Interlachen Avenue, across from All Saints Episcopal Church and was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1995. The Club was founded in 1915, by Mrs. Charles Hosmer Morse, who served until 1918 as the first president.</i>
34.	CROSS Morse Blvd.

POI	<i>Lake Boat Tour. If you turn right onto Morse Blvd. and walk down to the lake, the Winter Park Scenic Boat Tour leaves hourly. The boat tour offers a fleet of six 18-passenger pontoon boats for an hour-long, guided cruise through three of the seven lakes, and two, narrow man-made canals, on the tranquil Winter Park chain of lakes. See many of the mansions lining the shores. Cash/check only is \$14.00 for adults and \$7.00 for children (ages 2-11); under 2 are free. Operating hours are 10-4, M-Su, except Christmas</i>
35.	Bear RIGHT onto E Webster Ave. Note the Winter Park Country Club on the left as you approach Webster Ave.
POI	<i>Winter Park Country Club. is one of the oldest golf courses in Florida. The course and clubhouse are listed on the National Register of Historic Places (1999). See #25 also.</i>
36.	LEFT onto Georgia Ave. crossing Webster.
37.	RIGHT onto Seminole Dr.
38.	RIGHT onto Palmer Ave.
39.	LEFT onto Temple Dr., carefully CROSS Palmer at the crosswalk.
40.	RIGHT onto Mayfield Ave. Walk on the left. Carefully cross Sunset Dr.
41.	Carefully CROSS and turn LEFT onto Phelps Ave. (at the entrance to Phelps Park; restrooms available).
42.	RIGHT onto Pine Ave.
43.	LEFT onto N Lakemont Ave. Go to Instruction #1
