Driving directions to start point at University City Library, 6701 Delmar Blvd., University City, MO, 63130 (GPS: 38.656366,-90.309339). From I-64 Exit 33A go North on Big Bend Blvd. for 1.9 miles to Delmar Blvd. Right on Delmar approx. 0.25 mile to Kingsland Ave. Left on Kingsland, then right into free public parking lot across Kingsland from the library. Rest rooms at library and on the trail.

NOTE: Please use **EITHER** the Online Start Box (**OSB**) **OR** the Physical Start Box (**PSB**) to register and complete this event. Do NOT mix and match, for example, by registering using the OSB then completing your event using the PSB and/or signing the PSB log sheet. The sponsoring club only receives credit for an OSB participation when an OSB registration has been completed online by entering your participation date, distances, and any special programs using the OSB.

OSB COMPLETION AND CREDIT: Be sure to log back into the OSB system to "finish/complete" your online registration after doing the event. The OSB system does not deduct any event fee from a participant's Event Bank until they have submitted event completion info including the date of the event, the distance, and the selection of applicable special programs that person is participating in. (Nevertheless, a fee of \$2 for a downloaded PDF is deducted from the user's Event Bank when the PDF is downloaded. Later, any PDF fees are credited back to a user's Event Bank when he/she submits the event completion info as a paying for credit participant. Note, however, the \$2 coupon for the downloaded PDF will expire in 60 days.)

Special Programs: Ice Cream Parlors (Ben & Jerry's and Snow Factory); Rockin' Around the Clock (Brookings Hall on Wash U campus); Walk Like an Olympian (St. Louis – 1904 Olympics); Walking the USA A to Z ("U"); Walking Missouri Counties (*St. Louis City and County*)

Legend: TR = Turn Right, TL = Turn Left, SA = Straight Ahead, CR = Cross, SP = Special Program Qualifier

- EXIT** through the front door of the library to **Delmar Blvd.**
- TURN RIGHT (WEST)** on the sidewalk. Cross **Sgt. Mike King Dr.** and look to your right for the City Hall of University City, built in 1903 as the Women's Magazine Building by Edward Garner Lewis, the founder of University City. Straight ahead are the **Lion Gates**, built in 1909 to guard the entrance to University Heights, an early 1900's subdivision developed by Mr. Lewis.
- Just before the traffic circle, **TL & CR Delmar Blvd.** at the marked crosswalk.
- TR** and follow the sidewalk as it curves left along **Trinity Ave.** The 560 Music Center will be on your left and University United Methodist Church on your right.
- CONTINUE SOUTH** on **Trinity Ave.** for two blocks to **Kingsbury Blvd.**, passing COCA – The Center of Creative Arts, on your left.
- CR Kingsbury Blvd.** & **TL** walking on the right (south) side of **Kingsbury** for 2-1/2 blocks. After crossing **Melville Ave.** you will see a (closed) gate straight ahead.
- Just before the gate **TR** on the **Centennial Greenway** (concrete sidewalk, sign says "Greenway South") and continue south to the pedestrian bridge which crosses Forest Park Pkwy. & the Metro Link rail tracks.
- After crossing the bridge, **CONTINUE SA** a short distance, up a flight of steps (or the ramp to your right) to the center of the **Danforth Campus of Washington University.** **TR (WEST)** on the sidewalk at the top of the steps. **Olin Library** is on your left (**Rest Rooms** are just inside the entrance). **CONTINUE** walking west, passing Louderman Hall, Olin Women's Bldg., and the Laboratory Sciences Bldg. on your right.
- CONTINUE SA** through the McMillan Hall arch. At the end of the brick sidewalk, **TL** through the iron gate, then **TR** and continue west, passing Bauer Hall, Knight Center, and Anheuser-Busch Hall on your right, and Seigle Hall on your left.

10. **CONTINUE SA** with tennis courts on your left and several “Greek” houses on your right.
11. At the end of the sidewalk, **TL (SOUTH)** passing the Wash U Athletic Ctr. (site of several recent presidential and vice-presidential debates) on your right. Note the statue of the Wash U Bears, the mascots of Wash U athletic teams. **SA** is **Francis Field**, site of the 1904 Olympics (**SP**).
12. Just before the Francis Field fence, **TL (EAST)** and **CONTINUE SA** (passing, on your left, an **Olympic Rings Monument**, erected in 2018 to commemorate the 1904 Olympics. The 2nd building on your right is the Danforth Univ. Ctr. (**the DUC**), which contains 6 restaurants, one of which, Café Bergson, is open Sat. & Sun. 9 to 3.
13. **CONTINUE SA** to historic **Graham Chapel**, completed in 1909 as the 12th building on the Wash U campus.
14. At Graham Chapel **TR**, then **TL** and proceed east a few yards to **“The Thinker on the Rock” statue**. Olin Library will be on your left.
15. From the “Thinker” statue **CONTINUE SA (EAST)** to the archway to the left of January Hall. Continue through this archway into the Brookings Quadrangle.
16. After entering the Quadrangle, **TURN DIAGONALLY LEFT** to the archway in Brookings Hall (**SP-clock above archway**).
17. **CONTINUE SA** through the Brookings Hall archway and down a long series of steps to the Tisch Park gathering area. At the bottom of the steps, on your left is Schnuck Pavilion and Parkside Café (open weekdays). On your right is **Sumers Welcome Center** (for more info on Wash U). The 2nd building on the right past the Sumers Welcome Center is the **Mildred Lane Kemper Art Museum**, which also contains the **Newman Money Museum**.
18. **CONTINUE SA** thru Tisch Park to **Skinker Blvd.** (**Forest Park** is across the street to your right).
19. **TL** on **Skinker Blvd.**, and proceed **NORTH** on **Skinker Blvd.**, crossing Forest Park Pkwy.
20. Just past the intersection of **Skinker Blvd.** and **Waterman Blvd.**, and across from Grace UM Church, **TL**, through a stone gate, into **Parkview Subdivision**, an early 20th century “Urban Oasis” placed on the National Registry of Historic Places in 1986.
21. At the “T” intersection just inside the stone gate, **TR** on **McPherson Ave.**, which goes west, and gradually curves to the north to **Center Ave.**
22. **CR Center Ave.** and proceed **SA** on **Westminster Place**, which continues north and gradually curves back east to **Skinker Blvd.**
23. **TL** on **Skinker Blvd.** to **Delmar Blvd.** When you reach Delmar Blvd., stop and look to your right to see the Pin-Up Bowl bowling alley, the Moonrise Hotel, and the Pageant Concert Hall on the north side of Delmar.
24. **TL** on **Delmar Blvd.** and walk to the west through the historic **Delmar Loop**. As you walk along Delmar, look for the brass plaques in the sidewalk, which are part of the St. Louis Walk of Fame, which honors notable people from St. Louis who made significant contributions to the culture of the United States. All inductees were either born in the Greater St. Louis Area or spent their formative or creative years here.
25. Also along the Delmar Loop, look for the Tivoli Theater at 6350 Delmar, Ben and Jerry’s Ice Cream (**SP**) at 6380 Delmar, iconic Blueberry Hill Restaurant at 6504 Delmar, Snow Factory Ice Cream (**SP**) at 6602 Delmar, and the **Chuck Berry statue** on the north side of Delmar at Melville Ave. (**Give Chuck’s statue a gentle shove – he “rocks”!**) There are also many other fine places to eat along this stretch of Delmar. If you are a music buff, stop in at Vintage Vinyl record shop at 6610 Delmar.
26. All good things must come to an end, including this walk, which ends back at the library at 6701 Delmar.

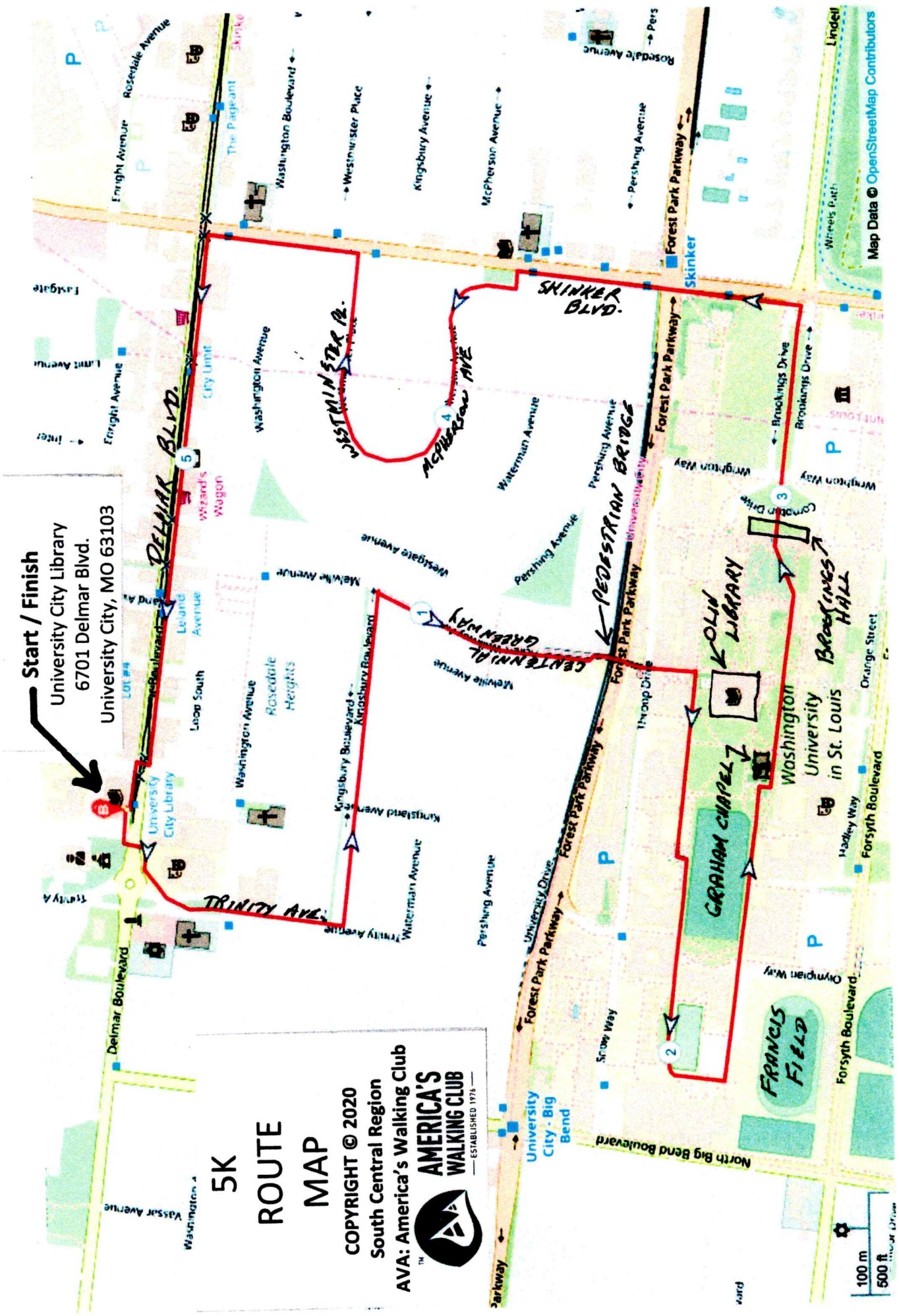

Driving directions to start point at University City Library, 6701 Delmar Blvd., University City, MO, 63130 (GPS: 38.656366,-90.309339). - EXIT** through the front door of the library to **Delmar Blvd.**
- TR (WEST)** on the sidewalk. **CR** Sgt. Mike King Dr. and look to your right for the **City Hall of University City**, built in 1903 as the Women's Magazine Building by Edward Garner Lewis, the founder of University City. Straight ahead are the **Lion Gates**, built in 1909 to guard the entrance to University Heights, an early 1900's subdivision developed by Mr. Lewis.
- Follow the sidewalk as it curves right and continue a short distance on **Trinity Ave.**
- At the “Y” intersection with **Princeton Ave.**, **TL & CONTINUE WEST** on **Princeton Ave.**
- At the next intersection, **CR** Cornell Ave. and **CONTINUE SA** on **Yale Ave.** (**NOTE: At this point, to avoid the 30-step stairway exiting Lewis Park, TURN LEFT on Yale Ave. to Delmar Blvd., then go to step #7**)
- After a very short distance on **Yale Ave.**, at the first house on your right (700 Yale Ave), **TL & CR Yale Ave.** and **CONTINUE SA** on the paved path, by the stone wall, into **Lewis Park**. At the “T” intersection at the end of the path, **TL** and continue past the small lake on your left to the steps exiting Lewis Park to **Delmar Blvd.**
- TR** on **Delmar** for several blocks, to **Hanley Rd.**
- TL & CR Delmar Blvd.**, and continue **SA** on **Hanley Rd.** for one block to **Teasdale Ave.**
- TL** on **Teasdale Ave.** to **Jackson Ave.**
- TR** on **Jackson Ave.** to **Kingsbury Blvd.**
- CR & TL** on **Kingsbury**, walking on the right side of Kingsbury for several blocks to **Big Bend Blvd.** **CR Big Bend Blvd.** at the traffic light. (**NOTE: At this point, to avoid numerous steps on the Washington Univ. campus, TURN RIGHT on Big Bend Blvd. to Forsyth Blvd. TURN LEFT on Forsyth Blvd. to Skinker Blvd. TURN LEFT on Skinker Blvd. to Forest Park Parkway, and go to step #25.**)
- After crossing **Big Bend Blvd.**, **CONTINUE SA** on **Kingsbury Blvd.** for 3 more blocks. After crossing **Melville Ave.** you will see a (closed) gate straight ahead.
- Just before the gate **TR** on the **Centennial Greenway** (concrete sidewalk, sign says “Greenway South”) and continue south to the pedestrian bridge which crosses Forest Park Pkwy. & the Metro Link rail tracks.

14. After crossing the bridge, **CONTINUE SA** a short distance, up a flight of steps (or the ramp to your right) to the center of the **Danforth Campus of Washington University**. **TR (WEST)** on the sidewalk at the top of the steps. **Olin Library** is on your left (**Rest Rooms** are just inside the entrance). **CONTINUE** walking west, passing Louderman Hall, Olin Women's Bldg., and the Laboratory Sciences Bldg. on your right.

23. **CONTINUE SA** through the Brookings Hall archway and down a long series of steps to the Tisch Park gathering area. 26. Just past the intersection of **Skinker Blvd.** and **Waterman Blvd.**, and across from Grace UM Church, **TL**, through a stone gate, into **Parkview Subdivision**, an early 20th century "Urban Oasis" placed on the National Registry of Historic Places in 1986.
27. At the "T" intersection just inside the stone gate, **TR** on **McPherson Ave.**, which goes west, and gradually curves to the north to **Center Ave.**
28. **CR Center Ave.** and proceed **SA** on **Westminster Place**, which continues north and gradually curves back east to **Skinker Blvd.**
29. **TL** on **Skinker Blvd.** to **Delmar Blvd.** When you reach Delmar Blvd., stop and look to your right to see the Pin-Up Bowl bowling alley, the Moonrise Hotel, and the Pageant Concert Hall on the north side of Delmar.
30. **TL** on **Delmar Blvd.** and walk to the west through the historic **Delmar Loop**. As you walk along Delmar, look for the brass plaques in the sidewalk, which are part of the St. Louis Walk of Fame, which honors notable people from St. Louis who made significant contributions to the culture of the United States. All inductees were either born in the Greater St. Louis Area or spent their formative or creative years here.

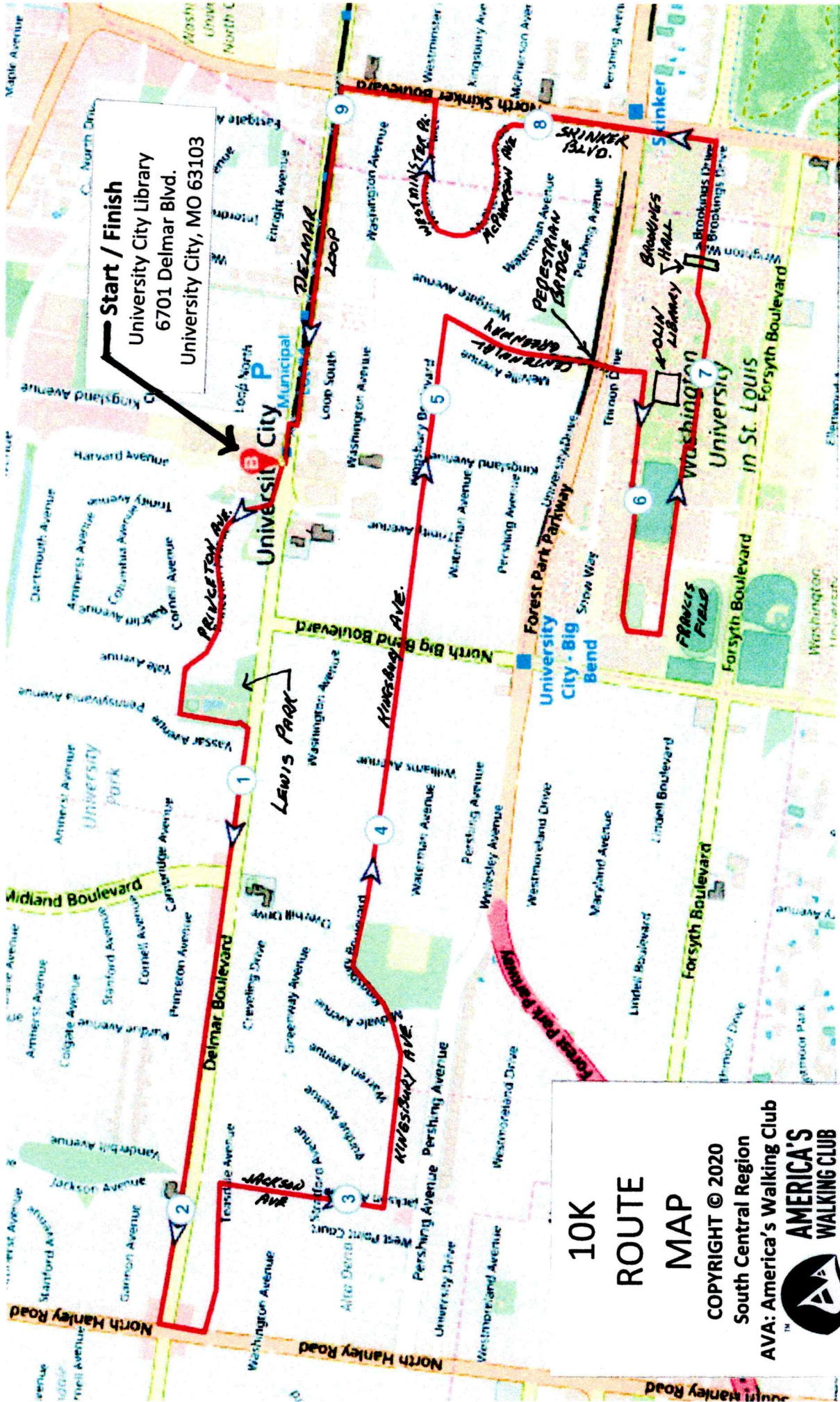
